Schools and Centres 21: Proposal for a statutory public consultation on the relocation of Gartcosh Primary School to new build campus facility

From Assistant Chief Executive (Education, Youth and Communities)

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Executive Summary

This report outlines proposals for a statutory public consultation on the relocation of Gartcosh Primary School to new build campus facility.

If approved, a statutory consultation will take place involving all statutory consultees, other stakeholders and interested parties.

The key reasons for this proposal are:

- (1) The council has been progressing its Schools and Centres 21 programme and this consultation proposal follows from the Committee Report on Schools and Centres 21 Phase 3 Investment approved at Education Committee on 1st March 2017. At this committee the review of the primary school estate in the Northern Corridor led to recommendation 8(ii)b being adopted to conduct a statutory consultation on a proposal for a new build campus in Gartcosh for Gartcosh Primary.
- (2) The pupils currently at Gartcosh Primary School will benefit educationally by attending a new build school which can offer a wider range of educational opportunities (see Appendix 1 for full statement of educational and community benefits).
- (3) The capital investment will provide local opportunities for economic investment.

Recommendations

The Education Committee is recommended to approve

- (i) That a formal consultation takes place on the proposal to relocate the existing Gartcosh Primary School to a new build campus facility.
- (ii) That the attached statutory consultation document (Appendix 1) be approved and made available to all statutory consultees, other stakeholders and interested parties.

- (iii) That all statutory consultees, other stakeholders and interested parties be invited to return consultation forms to Education, Youth and Communities, Gartcosh Primary Consultation Municipal Buildings, Kildonan Street, Coatbridge, ML5 3BT no later than 18 April 2018, on the understanding that these views will be taken into account by the Education Committee; and
- (iv) the timeline for consultation as set out in Appendix 2 to the consultation document

Appendix 1 Statutory Consultation Document on proposal to relocate Gartcosh Primary School to a new build campus facility.

1. Background

1.1 Schools (Consultation) (Scotland) Act 2010

The provisions of the above Act place a statutory duty on education authorities to carry out formal consultations on new build proposals for schools when the proposal is to relocate the existing school to a new build site.

1.2 The Act requires education authorities to prepare an educational benefits statement, to prepare (and publish) a proposal paper in respect of any proposal which falls within the terms of the Act, give notice of the proposal to the relevant consultees (and invite representations) in accordance with the Act, to hold (and give notice of) a public meeting, to involve Education Scotland..

1.3 Following the period of consultation, the education authority must review the proposal in accordance with the Act and prepare (and publish) a consultation report in accordance with relevant sections of the Act.

1.4 After publication of the education authority report, Education Scotland publish a report on the consultation taking account of the previously published education authority report before a final decision is made by the Council

2. Report

2.1 The council is progressing its Schools and Centres 21 programme and this consultation proposal follows from the Committee Report on Schools and Centres 21 Phase 3 Investment approved at Education Committee on 1st March 2017. At this committee the review of the primary school estate in the Northern Corridor led to recommendation 8 (ii) b being adopted to conduct a statutory consultation on a proposal for a new build campus in Gartcosh for Gartcosh Primary.

2.2 The pupils currently at Gartcosh Primary School will benefit educationally by attending a new build school which can offer a wider range of educational opportunities (see Educational and Community Benefits sections in Appendix 1).

2.3 The Scottish Government is currently implementing a significant expansion of early learning and childcare provision moving from 600 hours to 1140 hours of entitlement. The Education, Youth and Communities service, on behalf of the Council, is planning a significant expansion of current provision in early learning and childcare provision. At present Gartcosh Primary School does not include early learning and childcare provision. This will remain under review as part of the Council's 1140 hours Expansion Programme.

2.4 The capital investment will provide local opportunities for economic investment.

3. Implications

3.1 Financial Impact

Based on previous experience of new build projects within North Lanarkshire, it is anticipated this proposal will have a limited impact on school revenue budgets.

3.2 HR/Policy/Legislative Impact

The proposal should not have significant implications for teaching or non-teaching staffing. Any matter which arises will be dealt with within the terms of local and national agreements.

A full Equality Impact Assessment (stage 2) will be required which will be informed by the consultation responses. This will be published on the Council website.

3.3 Environmental Impact

A positive environmental impact should result from this project once completed since the building will be constructed in line with modern energy efficient practices and should have a smaller carbon footprint than the existing school. The local area will be impacted on during the building phase.

3.4 Risk Impact

A positive environmental impact should result from this project once completed since the building will be constructed in line with modern energy efficient practices and should have a smaller carbon footprint than the existing school. The local area will be impacted on during the building phase.

4. Measures of success

4.1 Consultation process which discharges the Council's statutory requirement under the terms of the Schools (Consultation) (Scotland) Act 2010.

4.2 A consultation process which ensures effective engagement with statutory consultees, other stakeholders and all interested parties.

1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 Gartcosh Primary School is a non-denominational primary school which was built in 1913 and is located in Lochend Road, Gartcosh. Seven miles east of Glasgow City Centre and seven miles west of Cumbernauld.
The present school building was opened in 1913; it is a traditional two storey stone construction with pitched and slated roof. Within the building there are seven classrooms off the central hall. The administration block is situated upstairs and the school dinner hall is outside in the playground in what was the original school building (dated 1875). There is also a modular unit within the school grounds which has temporary accommodation for two classrooms.
- 1.2 The current capacity of the school accommodation is 250 which includes 62 spaces created through the temporary two class modular unit. The permanent capacity of the school is 188. The current roll was recorded at 196 in September 2017 during the annual census return to Scottish Government.
- 1.3 Gartcosh Primary school has no associated nursery class within the current campus.

2 CONSULTATION REQUIREMENTS

- 2.1 In terms of the Schools (Consultation) (Scotland) Act 2010, the Education Authority is required to publish details of, and consult on, any proposal to relocate a school. See section 10 for more information about the statutory consultation process.
- 2.2 North Lanarkshire Council will not make any decision, or put any changes into effect, until the consultation period has been concluded in line with statutory requirements.
- 2.3 The consultation period will be a total of 55 days, which includes 30 school days, including 10 school holidays. The consultation starts on Wednesday 21 February 2018 and concludes on Wednesday 18th April 2018.
- 2.4 The consultation will involve pupils, parents/carers, Parent Councils and staff of the schools involved as well as other associated stakeholders and statutory consultees.
- 2.5 A public meeting will be held at Gartcosh Primary School on Monday 5th March 2018 at 7pm.
- 2.6 Council officers will be present at the public meetings to discuss the proposal and there will be an opportunity to ask questions. It is appreciated, however that there is a limited time at the meetings to discuss everything fully and not everyone is comfortable with speaking publicly. To make sure that all issues are covered, advance notice of specific questions or issues may be submitted in writing in advance of the public meeting, see contact details at 2.9.
- 2.7 At the end of the consultation process, a report will be prepared for North Lanarkshire Council detailing all responses received, summaries of their content

and a statement from Education Scotland on the educational aspects of the proposal. An officer response to the issues raised through the consultation will also be incorporated in the report. Copied of the report will be available, prior to consideration by the council, in both schools, local libraries and online. It is envisaged that the report will be published in June 2018. The key dates are set out in Appendix 2.

- 2.10 All interested parties are invited to submit their comments on or before Wednesday 18 April 2018.

3. PROPOSAL

- 3.1 The proposal in this document is to relocate Gartcosh Primary School to a new build campus facility within the existing catchment area. There are two main reasons for this proposal:
- (1) The current Gartcosh Primary School is in need of replacement due to levels of housebuilding in the area. The new school building will be a significant improvement on the current establishment. The new school will be fully accessible and equipped with modern technology to ensure the best learning opportunities are afforded to every child.
 - (2) The capital investment will provide local opportunities for economic investment.

- 3.2 It is proposed that the new school campus will be sited on land adjacent to Johnston Loch, within the area shown shaded yellow in Appendix 1. This land is currently open space and forms part of the Gartcosh Glenboig Community Growth Area (CGA), as designated within the North Lanarkshire Council Local Plan 2012.
- 3.3 During the period of the new build it is proposed that Gartcosh pupils will remain within their existing primary school. There will be no need for pupils to be decanted until the new build has been fully complete and pupils can make the transference over to their new campus.

- 3.4 If, following this statutory consultation, the Council proceeds with the proposed new build school, then the statutory planning process will be followed as required until completion of the project.

4. EARLY LEARNING AND CHILDCARE AND ADDITIONAL SUPPORTS NEEDS PROVISION

- 4.1 There is currently no early learning and childcare provision at Gartcosh Primary School. The Scottish Government is currently implementing a significant expansion of early years and childcare provision moving from 600 hours to 1140 hours of entitlement. The Education, Youth and Communities Service, on behalf of the Council, is planning a significant expansion of current provision in this area and although Gartcosh Primary School does not include early learning and childcare provision at present, this will remain under review as part of the Council's 1140 hours Expansion Programme.
- 4.2 The ambition of the Education, Youth and Communities service is that every child will be supported to achieve their full potential as close to their community as possible. To realise this ambition will require the creation and development of education services which are fully inclusive and can meet the needs of all learners. It is proposed to create an integrated Language and Communication Support Centre (LCSC) in the new Gartcosh Primary School. The creation of this new service within the new build campus will address the current capacity issues for Language and Communication Support provision within the North Locality. Currently, some children who have been identified as appropriate for more intensive Language and Communication support, but who, ideally, could access this within a mainstream environment, need to travel across the authority to have their educational needs met. The proposal to create an LCSC in Gartcosh Primary will allow a greater range of needs to be met locally in this area.
- 4.3 The proposal is to create a model similar to that offered in certain schools in other localities. Children would be co-educated with their mainstream peers but would receive intensive Language and Communication support as an integral part of their mainstream educational experiences. The capacity to deliver effective inclusion will be dependent on creating a learning environment that supports children and enables them to be fully included in their learning; they will be able to develop age appropriate friendships with mainstream and LCSC peers; have access to a range of curricular experiences to support their particular learning needs; be educated and supported by specialised staff and, crucially, access education that meets their needs but within their local community.
- 4.4 Some pupils from the Gartcosh Primary School catchment area may currently attend an LCSC in another part of the authority due to lack of this facility in the Gartcosh area. In such cases, once the new Gartcosh Primary School LCSC is built, parents/carers will have the opportunity to discuss with appropriate representatives of the Education Service, whether their child should remain at their current school or transfer back to Gartcosh Primary in their own catchment area.

5 EDUCATIONAL BENEFITS STATEMENT

- 5.1 The provision of a new school provides the opportunity to make available to pupils the most modern standards of school facilities and resources to support the delivery of the curriculum for excellence. The new facilities will offer flexible learning experiences which will contribute to the four contexts for learning:
- Ethos and life of the school
 - Curriculum
 - Inter-disciplinary learning
 - Personal achievement
- 5.2 The condition of the new school building will be a significant improvement on the current establishments. The new school will be fully accessible and equipped with modern technology to ensure the best learning opportunities are afforded to every child.
- 5.3 A new modern primary school will signal to the whole community that North Lanarkshire Council values 21st century learning. This new build will represent best value through the effective and efficient use of Council resources.
- 5.4 The new school will benefit from design practices which are informed by recent new developments in North Lanarkshire and elsewhere in Scotland and which support the varied range of teaching environments that best deliver learning.
- 5.5 Spaces for learning will be designed in such a way as to allow a range of teaching styles and approaches including: active learning, interdisciplinary learning and outdoor learning.
- 5.6 Experience in new school buildings has demonstrated that a new and flexible learning environment inspires pupils and has a positive impact on the general health and wellbeing of learners, increases their aspirations, attainment, achievement and positive destinations at a later stage in their education. This is evidenced through improving trends in attainment and achievement of our young people.
- 5.7 The curriculum will provide the opportunity for learners to achieve across all curricular areas and develop skills, attributes and capabilities through courses aligned with the design principles of Curriculum for Excellence: challenge and enjoyment, breadth, progression, depth, personalisation and choice, coherence and relevance.
- 5.8 Children and young people will be provided with a broad range of opportunities for personal achievement and interdisciplinary learning across all curricular areas by building on best practice in curriculum design in North Lanarkshire schools.
- 5.9 The area for the proposed site is very accessible. All parts of the highlighted area on the attached map (see Appendix 1) are within 1 mile of the existing Gartcosh Primary School. The proposed new build campus facility will be within the existing catchment area of the school. Pupils will, therefore, have similar walking routes and journeys to the new school, once completed.
- 5.10 As the Community Growth Area housing (CGA) is delivered, the school will become positioned within the community with access from all directions of the

catchment area. Having a school at the heart of the new community will provide a hub for learning, activities and facilities that will make a contribution to improving people's health and wellbeing, adding to the strength and vibrancy of its community.

- 5.11 The proposed new school will provide excellent facilities for children, families and other users outwith core school hours. The new school will provide accessible facilities that could be used to help meet the learning, leisure and social needs of the community.
- 5.12 The provision of high quality technology for learning will provide the potential to transform ways of learning and teaching by giving young people and staff flexible and ubiquitous access to a fully digital learning environment.
- 5.13 The shared flexible learning and teaching spaces in the new campus school will enable staff to work together in a collaborative manner and provide more opportunities for co-operative working between pupils.
- 5.14 The new school will be fully accessible to disabled learners as required by the Equality Act (2010). This will be ensured through the delivery of the Council's:-
 - Equality outcomes
 - Promoting Inclusive Design Protocol and
 - Partnership with North Lanarkshire Disability Access Panel.
- 5.15 The new school will be designed in such a way as to promote accessible, inclusive learning which will meet the needs of all learners including those with Additional Support Needs.
- 5.16 The new school's design, construction and operation will be environmentally and energy efficient; contributing directly to delivering the year-on-year reductions in greenhouse gas emissions introduced by the Climate Change (Scotland) Act 2009 and provide a rich context for learning for children and young people about sustainability now and in the future.

6. COMMUNITY IMPACT

- 6.1 The current Schools and Centres 21 Framework has delivered added value through:
 - A number of apprenticeships that have been created on the construction of the new schools.
 - Local employment opportunities.
 - Meaningful learning and engagement between the framework partners and the project schools.
 - Over 70% of the total investment being procured through local supply chains.
- 6.2 In order to maximise the level of local community benefit, regular meetings take place with framework contractors and the Council Schools and Centres 21 Team. Prior to a building contract being awarded, contractors appointed to the framework and their supply chains will be required to actively participate in the achievement of social, environmental and sustainability policy objectives relating

to local regeneration, social and economic growth, recruitment and training along with local supply chain initiatives. In addition sustainability will be a key objective on the construction of the new schools thereby contributing to the Council’s target of reducing our carbon footprint.

- 6.3 As well as the educational benefits specific to individual school projects, there will be wider educational benefits to the North Lanarkshire community in that, with the significant level of savings required to be made over the next few financial year’s the council would utilising resources more efficiently and effectively. This is in line with 2003 Best Value legislation and also the demands of the Education Scotland Act 1980.

7. IMPLICATIONS OF THE PROPOSALS - Appropriate supporting evidence or information

7.1 Rolls and Capacities

The projected rolls exclude placing requests but include house building estimates.

Note: Increased school roll is directly linked to rates of housebuilding in the area. Therefore, accelerated build rates would accelerate the demand on the school. Conversely, slower build rates would lengthen the timescale for increased pupil demand.

It is anticipated that, once all housebuilding in this catchment area is realised, the school roll will be in the region of 425 pupils (98%).

7.2 Transport to school

Council Policy currently provides free transport to those pupils living more than 1 mile from their zoned Primary School or where an appropriate walking route is not available. Education, Youth and Communities will arrange for an assessment of the walking routes to the site of a new school and appropriate road crossing patrols will be established if considered necessary.

7.3 Staffing

The proposal should not have significant implications for teaching or non-teaching staffing. Any matter which arises will be dealt with within the terms of local and national agreements.

7.4 Secondary Education

There will be no change to the primary to secondary transfer arrangement; the associated secondary school for Gartcosh Primary will remain Chryston High School. Parents who wish their children to attend an alternative secondary school will require to submit a placing request for their preferred school.

7.5 Class Sizes

Class structures are decided by the head teacher in accordance with authority guidelines and take account of a range of factors, including teacher deployment, school policies, the available accommodation and pupil numbers at each stage.

7.6 Future Use of the Existing School Buildings

Education, Youth and Communities will declare the existing school buildings surplus to its requirements should the proposal be approved. Thereafter, the council's Property Services will make recommendations on their future use or disposal in line with council policy.

7.7 Financial implications

Based on previous experience of new build projects within North Lanarkshire, it is anticipated this proposal will have a limited impact on school revenue budgets.

8. EQUALITY IMPACT ASSESSMENT

- 8.1 The Equality Impact Assessment, Stage 1 Initial Screening has been carried out using the Council Equality Impact Assessment Toolkit. This indicates that a full impact assessment (Stage 2) is required and information gathered during the consultation exercise will inform the assessment of impact on protected groups. The Equality Impact Assessment will inform the post consultation stage if the proposal is adopted.

9 INACCURACIES OR OMISSIONS

- 9.1 There is a statutory requirement for the Council to consider any allegation of an inaccuracy or omission in the proposal paper and determine whether the allegation has foundation. Where inaccuracies or omissions are notified to or discovered by the Council within this proposal document, the Council will determine if relevant information has, in its opinion been omitted or whether there is in fact an inaccuracy. Notifiers of any omissions or inaccuracies will be informed of the Council's decision and the reasons for that decision. Notifiers will also be informed of any action the Council is taking and of the reasons why it is or is not taking such action. The Council will invite the notifier to make further representations to the council if they disagree with the Council's determination or its decision as to whether to take action.
- 9.2 If the authority has found, either itself or through a concern being raised, that there is an inaccuracy or omission in the proposal paper, it must decide whether it relates to a material consideration relevant to the proposal. Where the confirmed inaccuracy or omission relates to a material consideration, there is a duty on the Council to correct it.
- 9.3 Appropriate action will then be taken by the Council depending on whether the inaccuracy or omission relates to a material consideration. Such action may include withdrawing the proposal and issuing a revised proposal paper for the whole consultation period; or issuing a corrected proposal paper with, if appropriate, an extension of the consultation period. In any of these eventualities, all relevant consultees (and, where applicable, the notifier(s) of any omissions or inaccuracies) and HMIE (Education Scotland) will be advised of the appropriate

action. Where inaccuracies or omissions are discovered within this proposal document, the Council will determine whether relevant information has been omitted or, if there has been an inaccuracy. Appropriate action will then be taken by the Council which may include issuing corrections, issuing a corrected proposal document or an extension of the consultation period. In any of these eventualities, all relevant consultees (and, where applicable, the notifier(s) of any omissions or inaccuracies) and Education Scotland will be advised of the appropriate action.

9.4 Notifiers of any omissions or inaccuracies will also be given the opportunity to make representations if they disagree with the Council's determination of and any action on the matter, which may result in the Council making a further determination/decision on the matter.

10 THE STATUTORY CONSULTATION PROCESS – ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

10.1 The current requirements for consulting are set out in the Schools (Consultation) (Scotland) Act 2010. This consultation will be carried out in accordance with the Act.

10.2 This consultation has been planned in order to meet the following statutory requirements:

- (1) The consultation document sets out the details of the proposal.
- (2) The proposal paper details the educational benefits of the proposal and other relevant information;
- (3) The proposal paper will be published and widely advertised.
- (4) North Lanarkshire Council will seek to determine whether there are inaccuracies or omissions within the proposal paper and take such action as it considers necessary.
- (5) The consultation period will be a period of at least 6 weeks, including at least 30 school days.
- (6) Prior to the commencement of the consultation period, the authority will give notice of the proposal to the relevant consultees. The relevant consultees are defined in the Schools (Consultation) (Scotland) Act 2010, and are as follows:



- the staff (teaching and other) at any affected school,
 - any trade union which appears to the education authority to be representative of the persons mentioned above
 - the community council (if any),
 - the community planning partnership (within the meaning of section 4(5) of the Community Empowerment (Scotland) Act 2015) for the area of the local authority in which any affected school is situated,
 - Any other community planning partnership that the education authority considers relevant,
 - Any other education authority that the education authority considers relevant,
 - Any other users of any affected school that the education authority considers relevant

- Education Scotland
 - Elected Members
 - SPT/local school transport providers
 - Police Scotland
 - Roads Department colleagues

- (7) During the consultation period, the authority will hold and be represented at public meetings on the relevant proposal.
- (8) The council will involve Education Scotland in the consultation process. This will culminate in Education Scotland preparing and submitting an independent report on the educational aspects of the proposal
- (9) Following the consultation period, the council will prepare and publish a consultation report. The report will be published at least three weeks before a final decision is taken on the proposal.
- (10) The consultation timeline provides further information on the timescales for various stages in the statutory process.
