Figure 1 : Bellshill Locality





Figure 2: Intermediate Datazones within Bellshill Locality





The projected population in Bellshill locality in 2036 is shown on the population pyramid on the right.







Estimated life expectancy in Bellshill social work locality, 2016 (2014-2018 5 year aggregate)




- Male life expectancy is highest in Craigneuk, Airdrie at 85.5 years and lowest in Craigneuk, Wishaw at 65.0 years
- Female life expectancy is highest in 2 areas Balloch East and Stepps (87.2 years) and lowest in Craigneuk, Wishaw (69.1 years).



Poverty and Deprivation



Bellshill SIMD by Datazone and Intermediate Datazone

The graph below is based on the SIMD 2020. It shows the percentage of people who are income and employment deprived within the locality at intermediate zone level. The number of people who are income deprived includes dependants of someone who is income deprived. This <u>webpage</u>³ provides information of the range of income and employment deprivation across North Lanarkshire.



Within the SIMD 2020 other issues highlighted by the data are:

- 6,631 people in Bellshill locality are regarded are income deprived, this is 16% of the locality population. The North Lanarkshire figure is 15% across and Scottish average is 12%
- 3,291 people of working age are employment deprived, this is 12% of the locality working age population, across North Lanarkshire it is 11% across and 9% across Scotland.
- 15 datazones (of 57 in the Bellshill SW locality) are within the 15% most deprived areas of the country.
- 17 datazones are within the 15% most health deprived areas of the country. The five datazones below are within the 5% most health deprived in the country.

Five datazones are within the 5% most deprived communities in Scotland. These are:

- Orbiston Amethyst Avenue to Sapphire Road Rank 131
- Viewpark Limetree Quadrant to Gopher Avenue Rank 132
- Holytown Shirrel Road to Sunnyside Crescent Rank 150
- Fallside Rosepark Avenue to Sanderson Avenue Rank 251
- Fallside Panther Drive to Merrick Terrace Rank 286

Seven datazones within the locality are within the 5% most education deprived nationally.



Children in low income households (%) August 2016


The percentage of children living in low income households varies from 40% in Craigneuk, Wishaw to 4% in Carrickstone.

Bellshill's A&E attendance rate has increased by around 8% over the last five years. Its rate has consistently remained slightly lower compared with North Lanarkshire however is consistently higher than the Scotland rate.



Bellshill's emergency admission rate has increased slightly over the last five years but has remained similar to the North Lanarkshire rate.


Emergency Admissions rate per 1,000



Bellshill has followed a trend similar to Scotland with a year on year decrease, as opposed to North Lanarkshire as a whole which had an increase in rate of bed days in 2017/18 before decreasing again.


A&E conversion to hospital admission (%)

Bellshill has the second lowest A&E attendance rate in North Lanarkshire, however the highest conversion rate to admissions. This could indicate that admissions could be more appropriately triaged. This percentage is consistently above the North Lanarkshire percentage as well as the Scotland figure.



Psychosis rate per 1,000





Bellshill has the highest psychosis prevalence rate of all localities in North Lanarkshire. It has also always remained above the North Lanarkshire rate for the last 5 years.


Mother and Baby Indicators

Across the six localities breastfeeding varies, from 2.8% in Bellshill Central to 31.3% in Ladywell, this compares to a council average of 15.2% and a national average of 27.1%.

Age of Older and Younger Mothers 2014-2017, 3 year aggregate




Healthy Birth Weight Babies, 2015 3 year aggregate (%)


All-cause mortality among the 15-44 year olds 2016 (rate per 100,000)



Early Deaths from Cancer 2014-2016 3 year aggregate (rate per 100,000)




Early Deaths from Coronary Heart Disease (CHD) <75 years, 2015 (rate per 100,000)




Patients Hospitalised with Coronary Heart Disease, 2014 (rate per 100,000)




Alcholol Related Hospital Stays, 2016 (rate per 100,000)




Patients (65+) with Multiple Emergency Hospitalisations 2016 (rate per 100,000)



Patients with Emergency Hospitalisations 2016 (rate per 100,000)




Patients Hospitalised with COPD 2014, 3-year aggregates 2013/14 to 2015/16 (rate per 100,000)



Incapacity Benefit / Severe Disablement Allowance 2015 (%)




