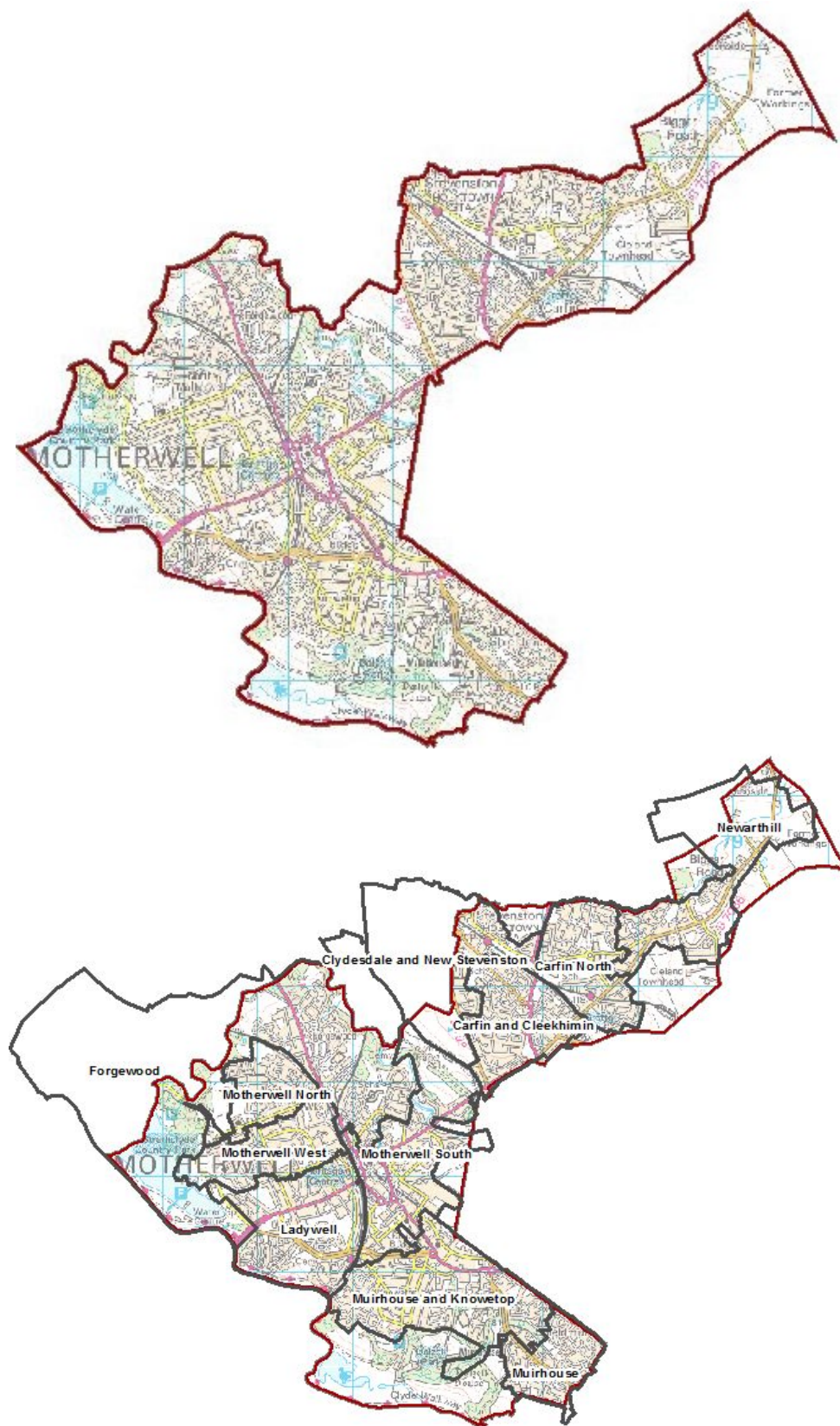
Locality Profile

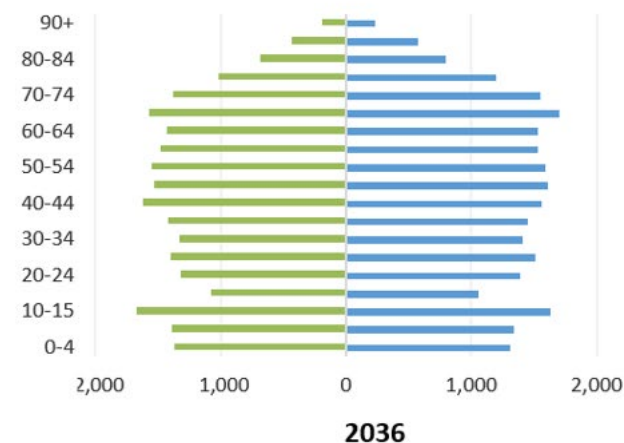
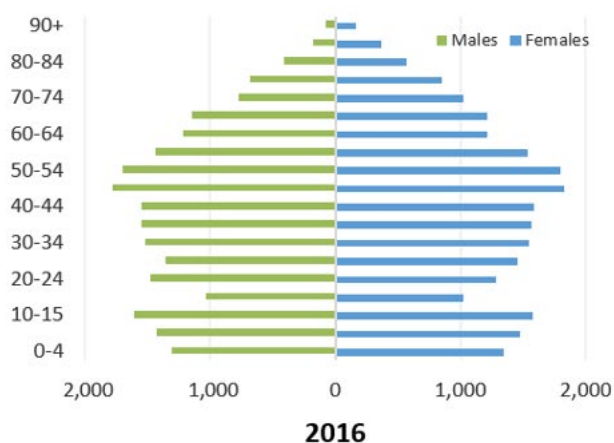

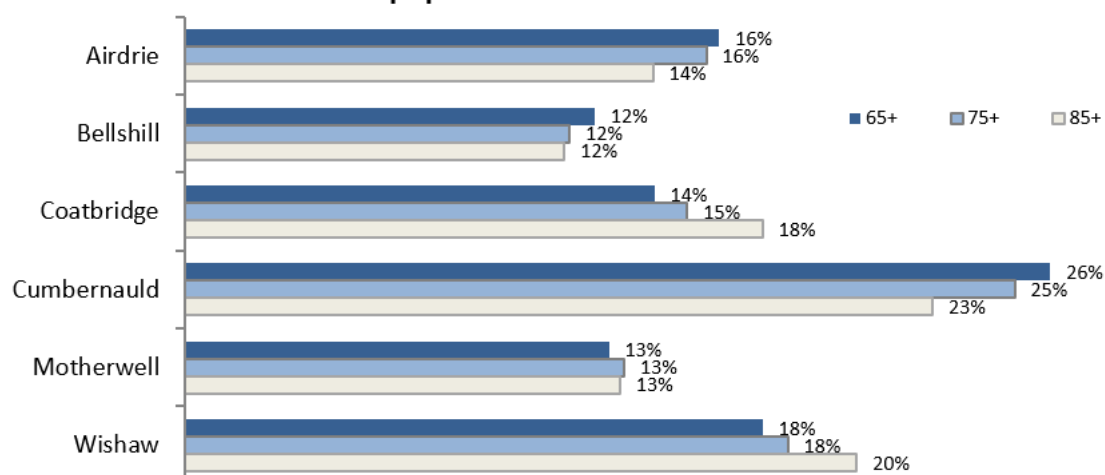

Where the 65+ population live in North Lanarkshire 2019



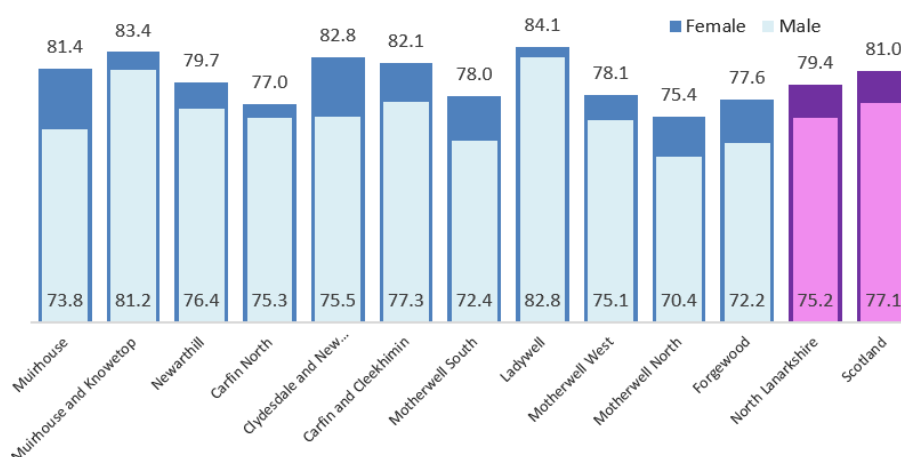

Estimated life expectancy in Motherwell social work locality, 2016 (2014-2018 5 year aggregate)



- Male life expectancy is highest in Craigneuk, Airdrie at 85.5 years and lowest in Craigneuk, Wishaw at 65.0 years
- Female life expectancy is highest in 2 areas - Balloch East and Stepps - (87.2 years) and lowest in Craigneuk, Wishaw (69.1 years).

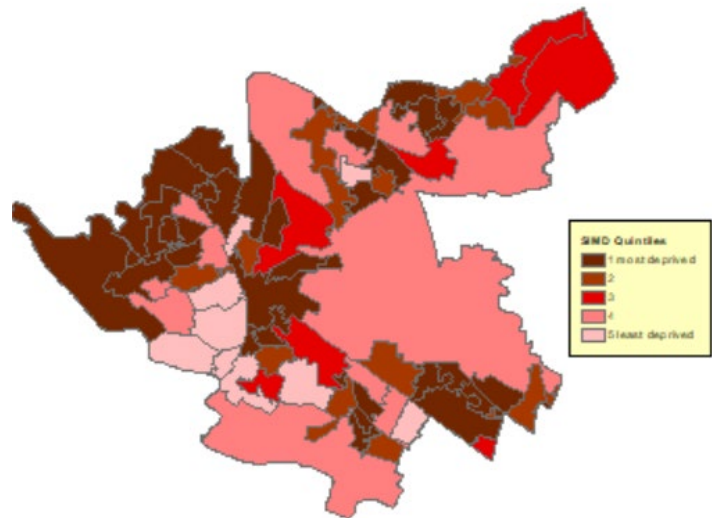
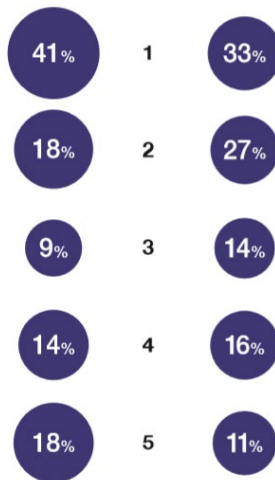

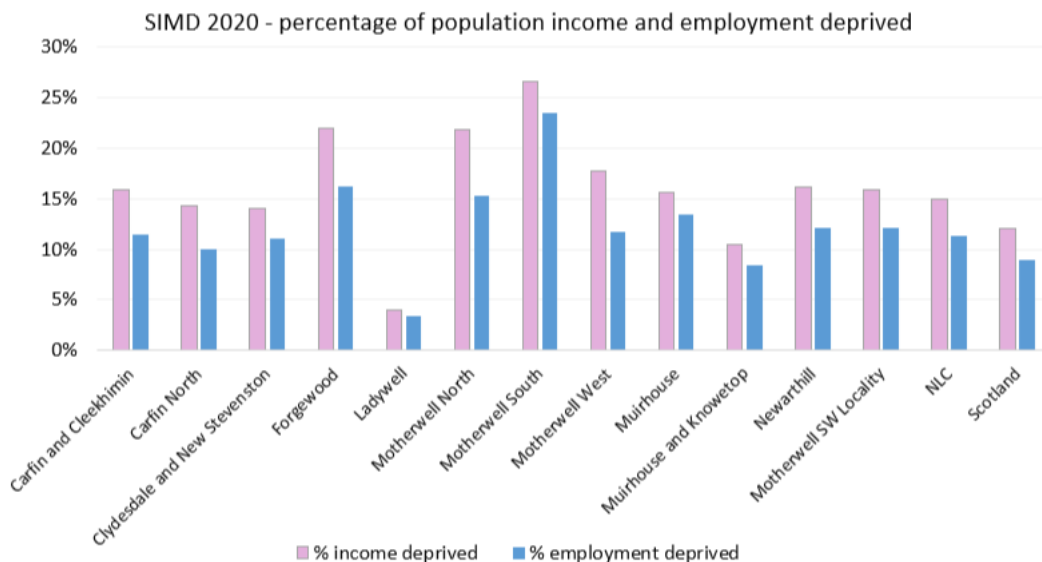

SIMD by datazone and intermediate datazone

The graph is based on the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD) 2020. It shows the percentage of people who are income and employment deprived within the locality. The number of people who are income deprived includes dependants of someone who is income deprived. This [webpage³](#) provides information of the range of income and employment deprivation across North Lanarkshire.



Within the SIMD 2020, other issues highlighted by the data are (1=most deprived; 6976 = least deprived):

- There are 58 datazones in Motherwell social work locality
- 18 of these datazones are within the 15% most deprived communities in Scotland
- 6 of the 18 are within the 5% most deprived in the country. These are:
 - Motherwell South - Airbles Road to Watson Street
 - Muirhouse - Shields Road to Keane Path
 - Forgewood - Braidhurst High School to Kylemore Roundabout

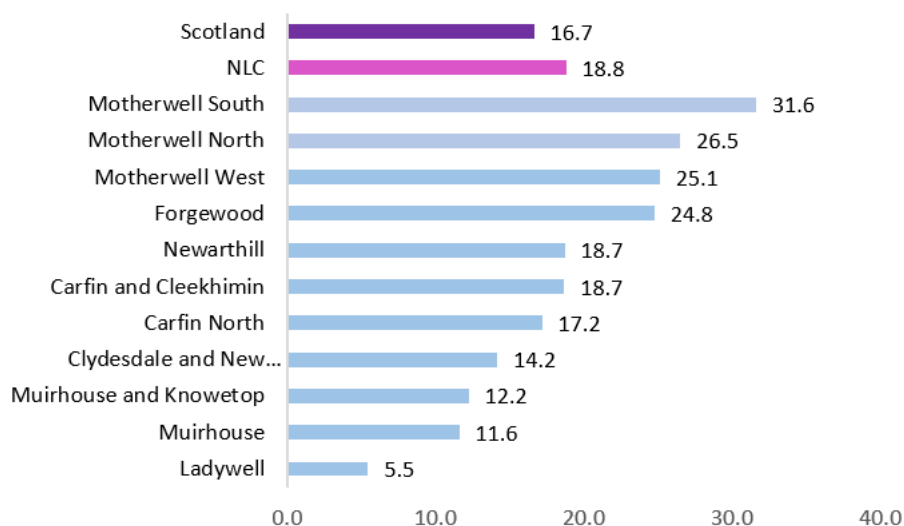

- Motherwell Town Centre
- Motherwell North - Logan Road to Watling Street
- Motherwell - Dalziel Street to Wilson Street

Twenty three of the 57 Motherwell datazones are within the 15% most deprived in terms of health in the country, with 8 in the 5% most actutely deprived in Scotland. These 5 areas are:

- Motherwell South - Airbles Road to Watson Street – rank 99
 - Motherwell Town Centre – rank 138
 - Forgewood - Braidhurst High School to Kylemore Roundabout - rank 200
 - Motherwell North - Logan Road to Watling Street – rank 242
 - Muirhouse - Shields Road to Keane Path – rank 311
 - Motherwell - Dalziel Street to Wilson Street – rank 320
 - Motherwell - Airbles Street - Camp Street – rank 332
 - Motherwell West - Kilbrennan Drive to Ailsa Avenue – rank 341
- 20 of the 58 datazones are within the 15% most deprived in the eduction domain within the SIMD, 5 of which are in the 5% most deprived. These 5 are:
 - Forgewood - Braidhurst High School to Kylemore Roundabout – rank 18
 - Forgewood - Firpark Primary to Bellshill Road – rank 94
 - Motherwell North - Magna Street to Chesters Crescent – rank 127
 - Motherwell North - Logan Road to Watling Street – rank 155
 - New Stevenson - Beech Avenue to Station Road – rank 195
 - Motherwell West - Cumbrae Drive to Dechmont Avenue – rank 200
 - Motherwell South - Airbles Road to Watson Street – rank 302

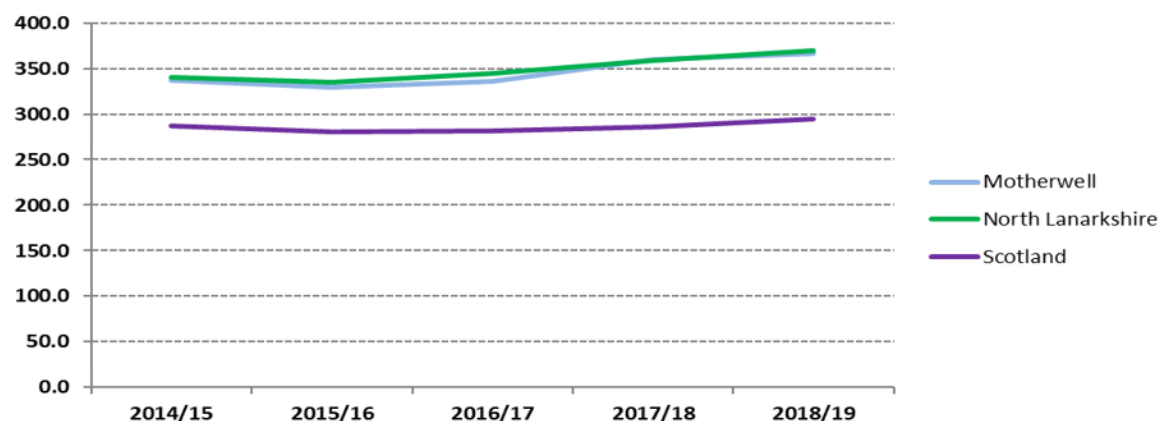
Children in low income households (%) August 2016

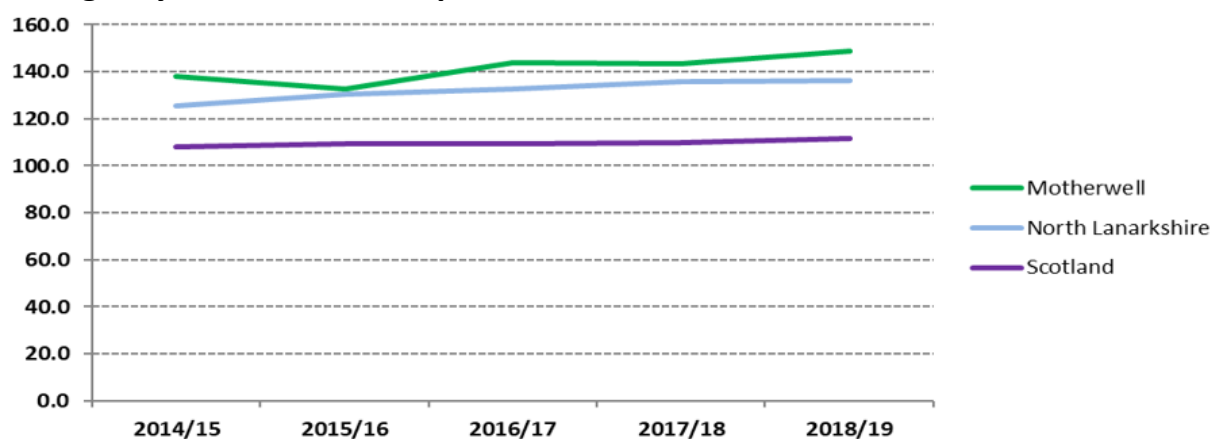

Motherwell and North Lanarkshire's emergency admission rates have been fairly similar over the last five years. Both have seen an increase of around 9% and remain consistently above the Scotland rate.

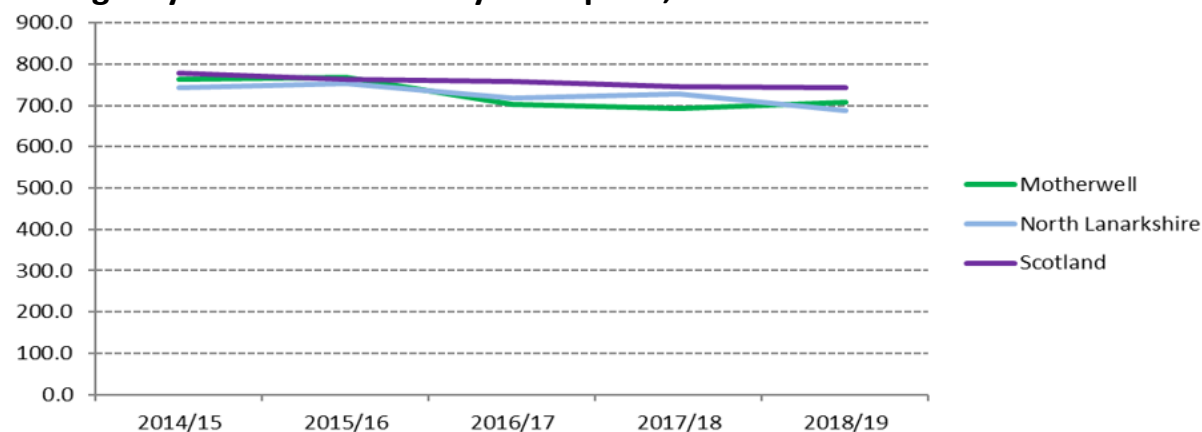

Motherwell's emergency admission rate has increased by around 8% over the last five years. The 2018/19 rate is around 10% higher compared with North Lanarkshire and has had a consistently higher rate year on year, compared to the partnership and Scotland as a whole.

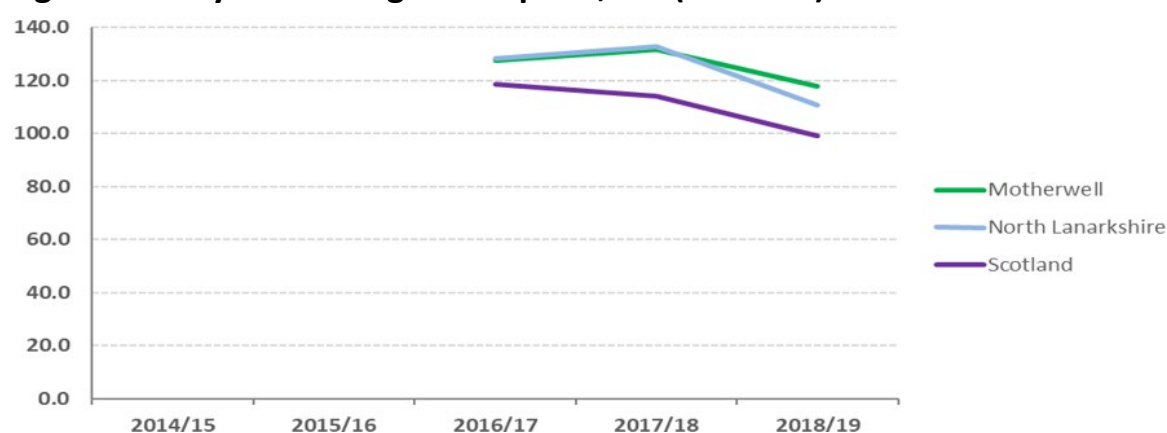

Motherwell's emergency admission bed days rate has decreased by around 7% over the last five years and has remained below the partnership and National rate since 2016/17.

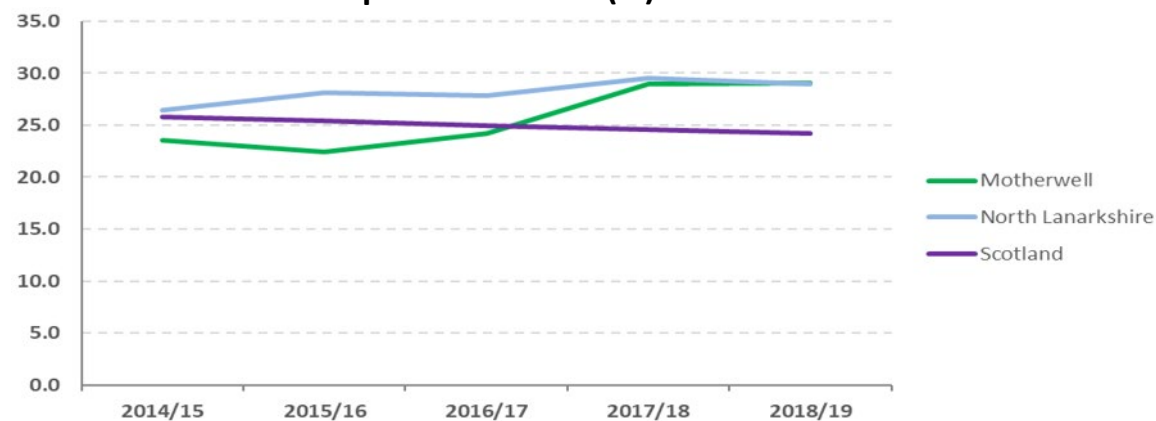
Age 18+ delayed discharges rate per 1,000 (Jul – Jun)

Motherwell's delayed discharge rate has followed a similar trend to both the partnership and national rate, showing a gradual overall decrease.

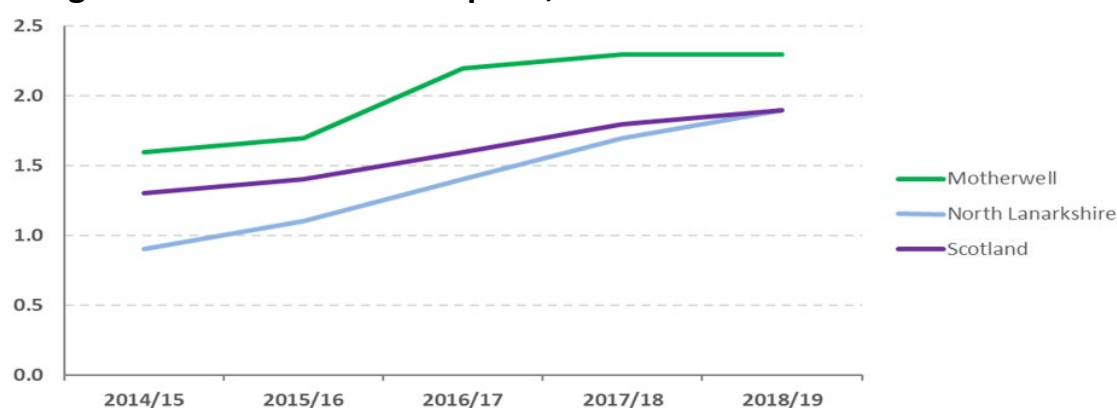
A&E conversion to hospital admission (%)

Motherwell's A&E conversion to admission rate has been gradually increasing year on year and in 2018/19, the rate has now crept above the partnership level. This trend is the opposite of what is being seen at a national level, where Scotland has been observing a gradual year on year decrease.

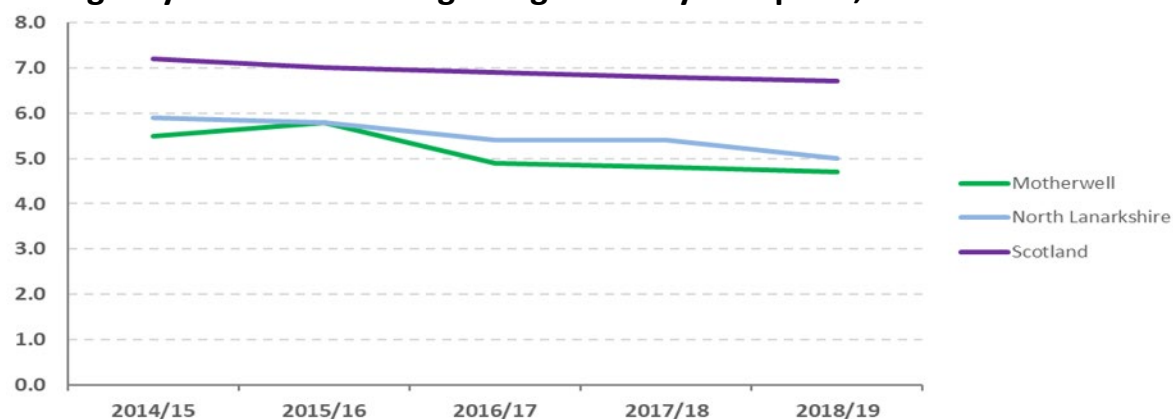

Motherwell's drug related admissions has consistently been above the partnership and national average rates, however the rate of increase appears to have slowed in the past 2 years, remaining at 2.3 admissions per 1,000.

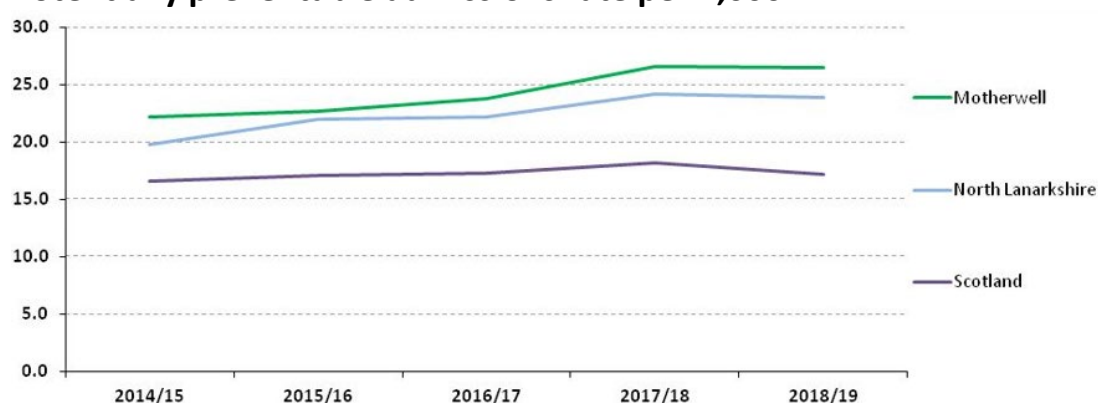

Motherwell has one of the lowest average lengths of stay for emergency admissions in North Lanarkshire; it also has one of the highest emergency admission and potentially preventable admission rates. This would show a potential for reducing overall admissions if preventable admission rates could be reduced.

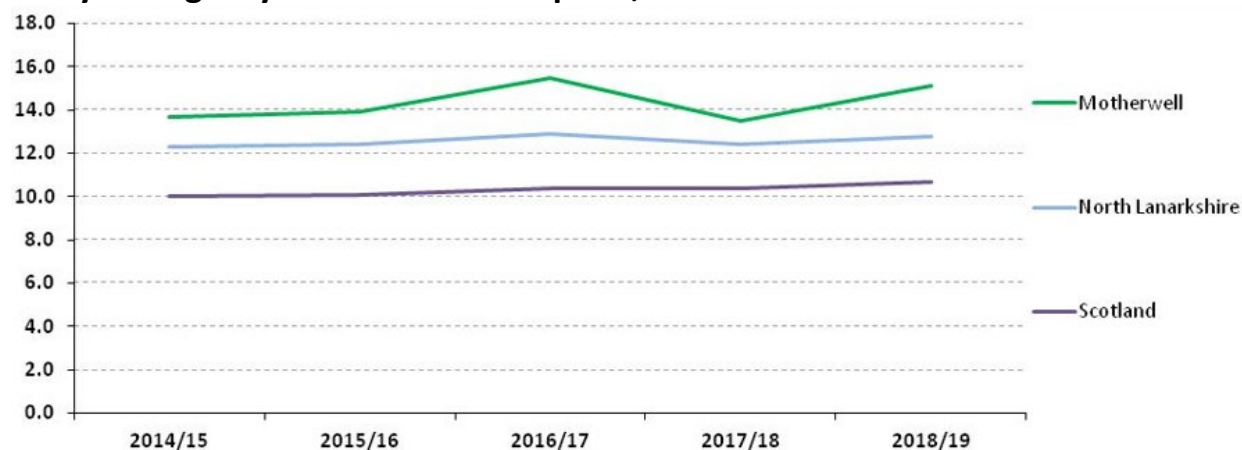

Motherwell's potentially preventable admissions rate has increased by around 20% over the last five years. For the last five years Motherwell's rate has been higher than the North Lanarkshire rate, with both being above the Scotland average.

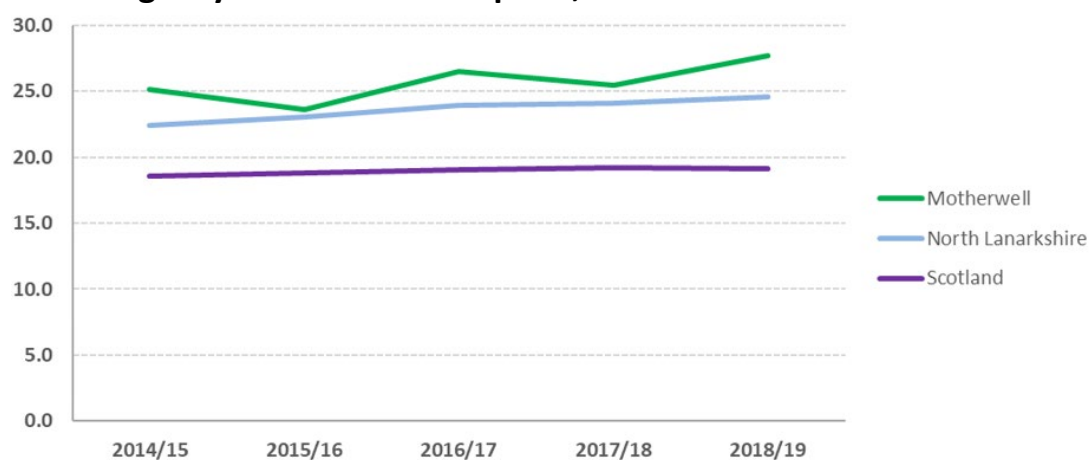
7 day emergency readmission rate per 1,000

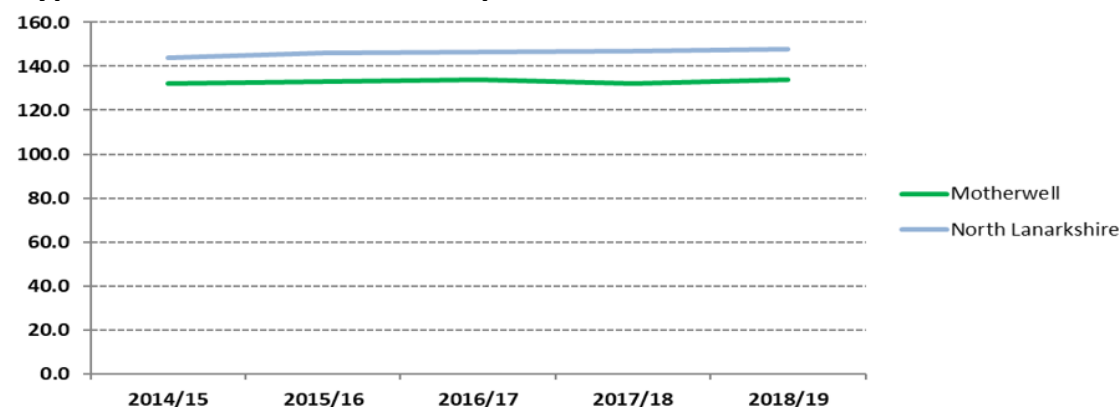

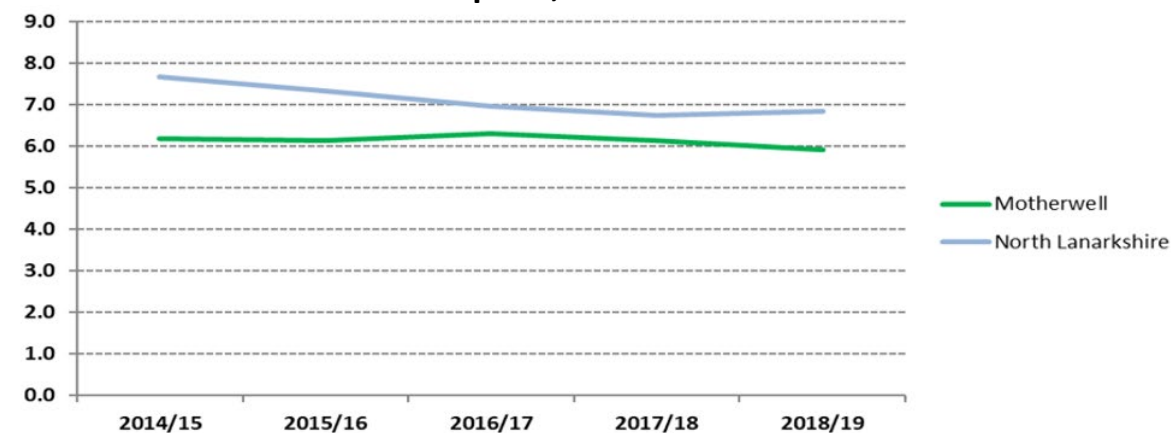

Motherwell's hypertension prevalence rate is the lowest of all localities in North Lanarkshire and has been for the previous five years.

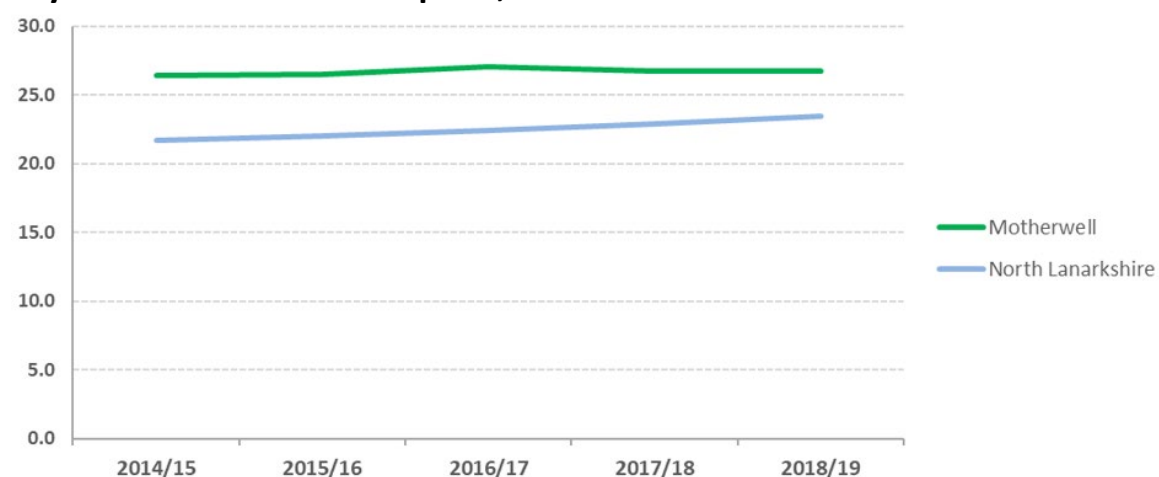

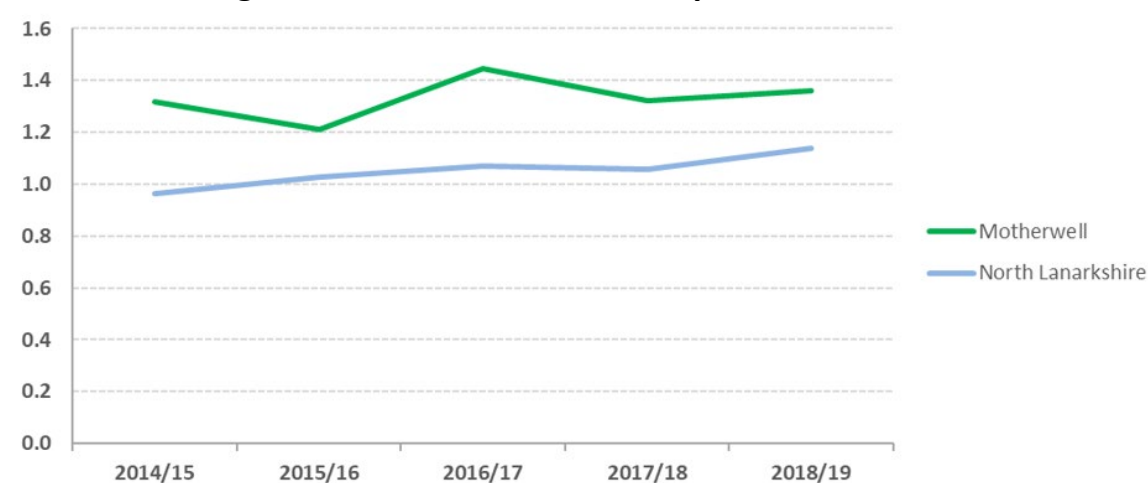

Other Neurological Disease Prevalence rate per 1,000



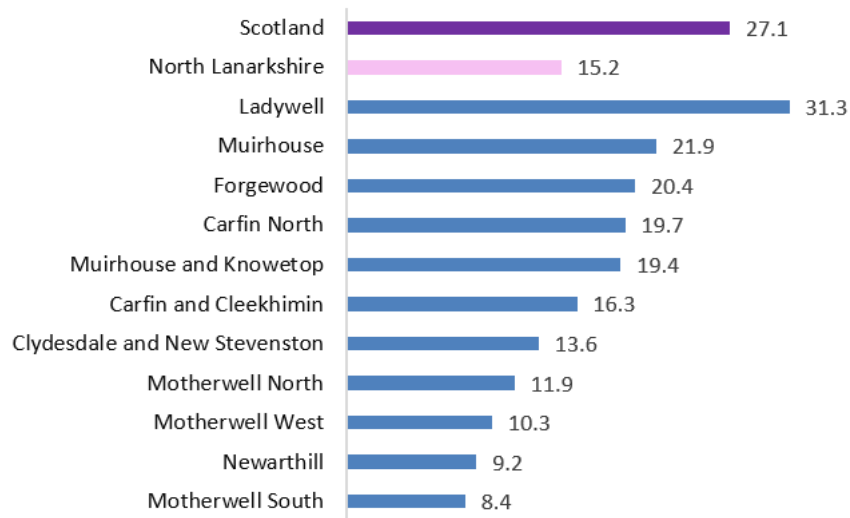

Motherwell has consistently had the highest other neurological disease prevalence rate of the North Lanarkshire localities over the past five years.

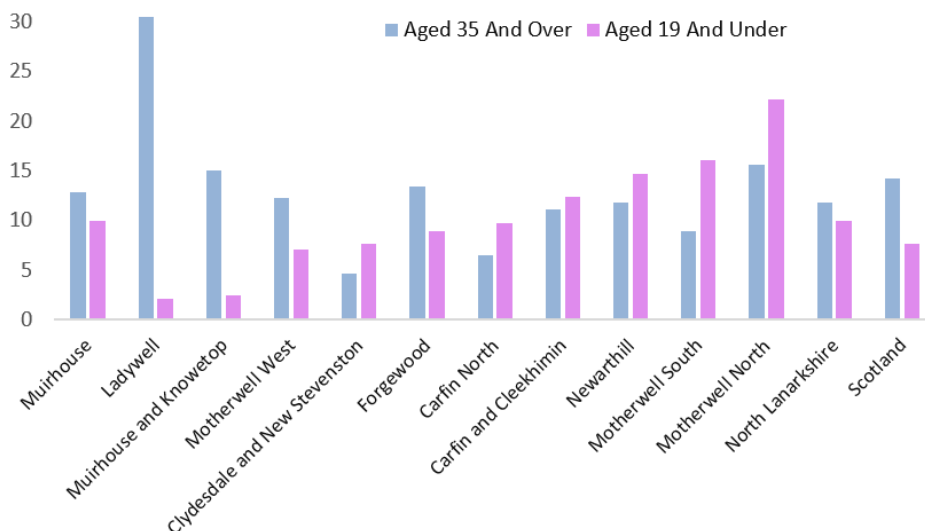
Mother and baby indicators

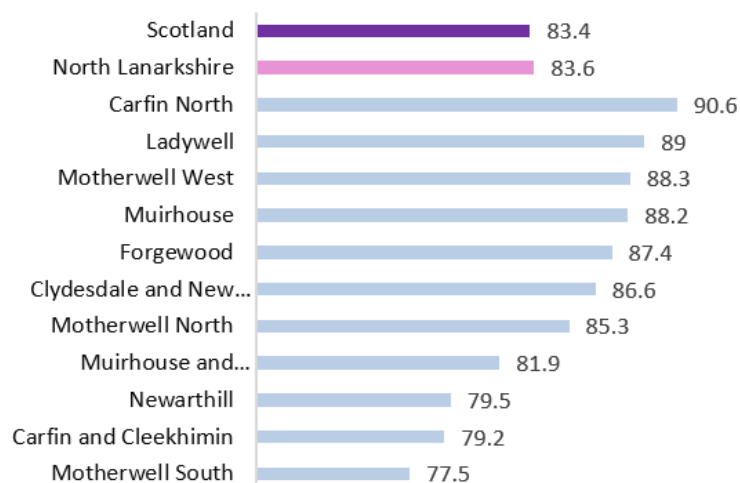
Babies exclusively breastfed at 6-8 weeks – 2015 based on 3 year aggregate (%)



Age of older and younger mothers 2014-2017 3-year aggregate (%)

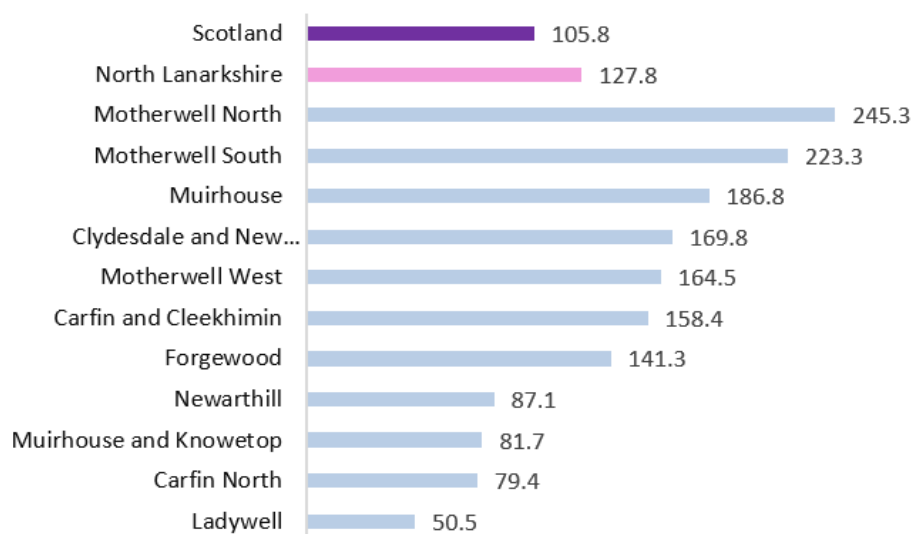


Healthy birth weight babies, 2015 3-year aggregate (%)

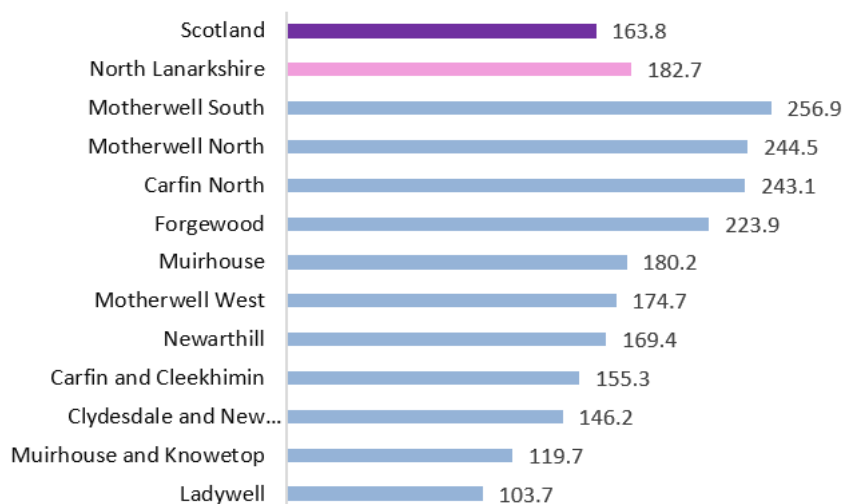

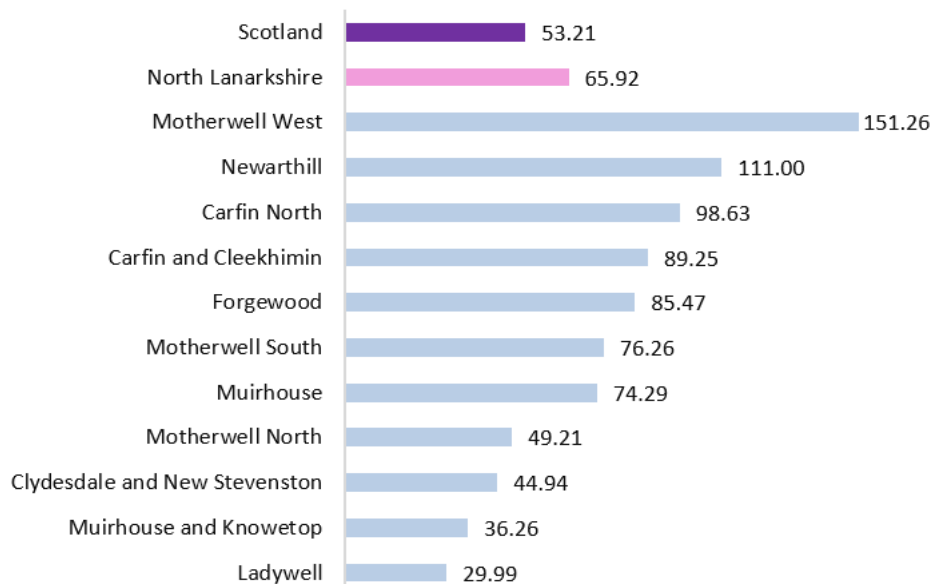
All-cause mortality among the 15-44 year olds 2016 (rate per 100,000)



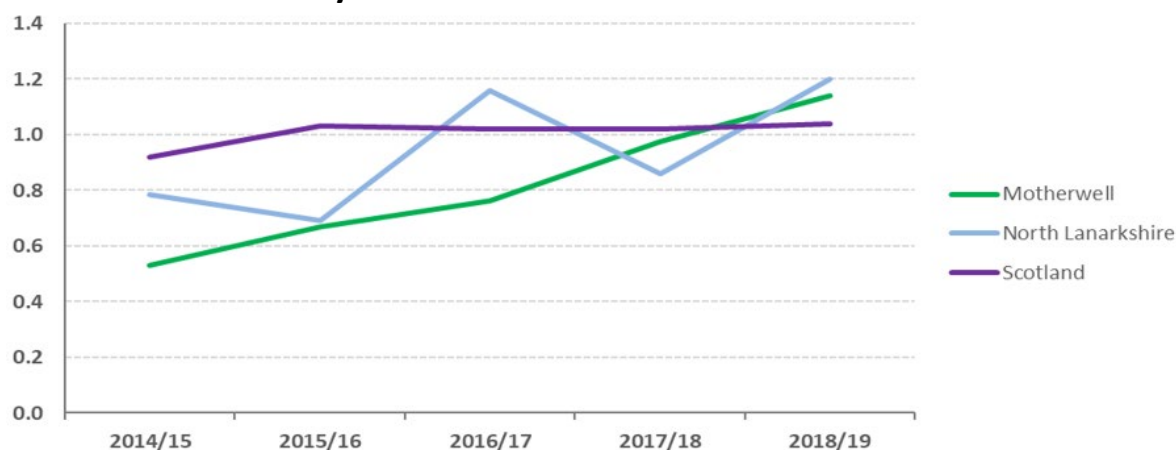
Early deaths from cancer 2014-2016 3 year aggregate (rate per 100,000)

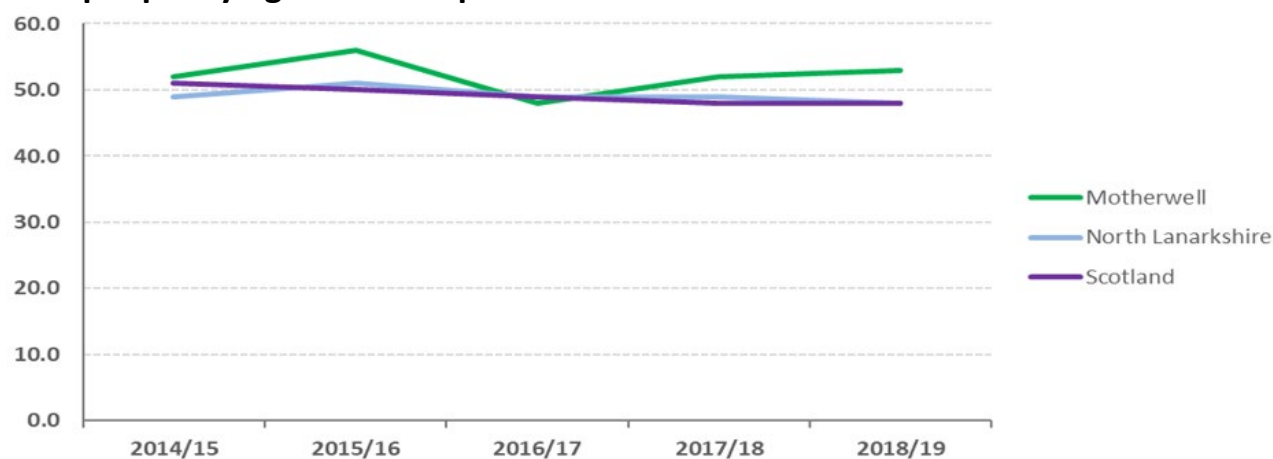

% of people dying in NHS hospital

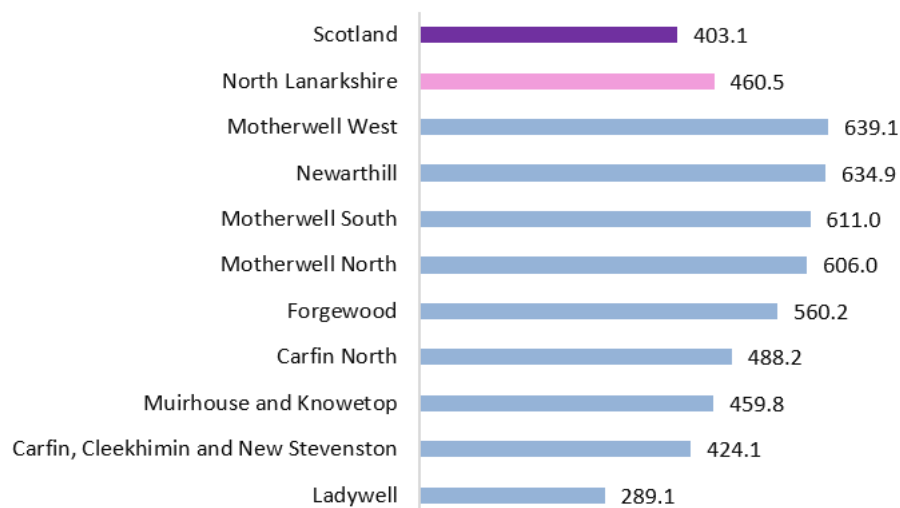

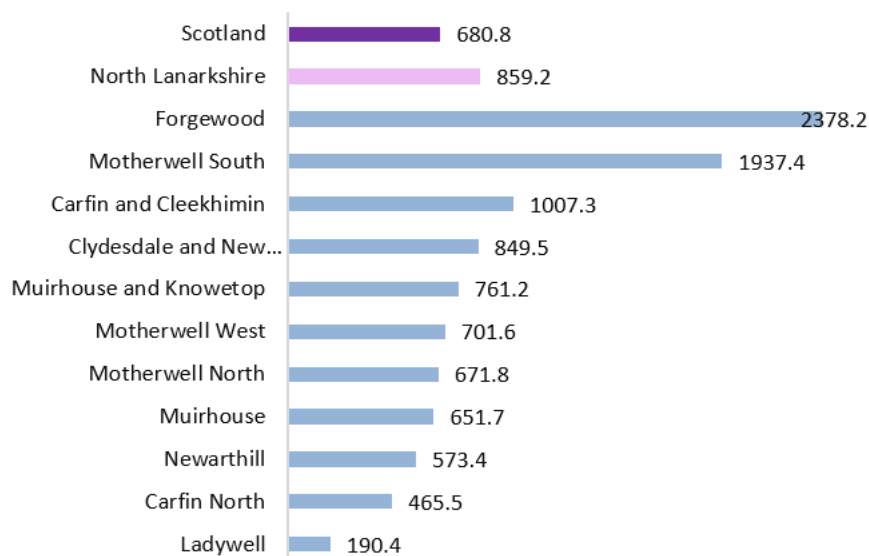

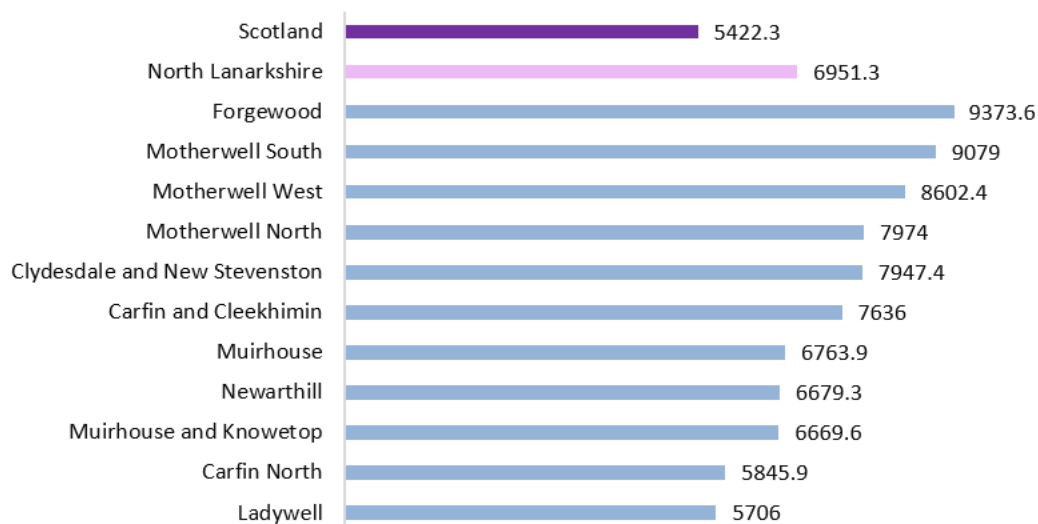
Patients hospitalised with coronary heart disease, 2014 (rate per 100,000)



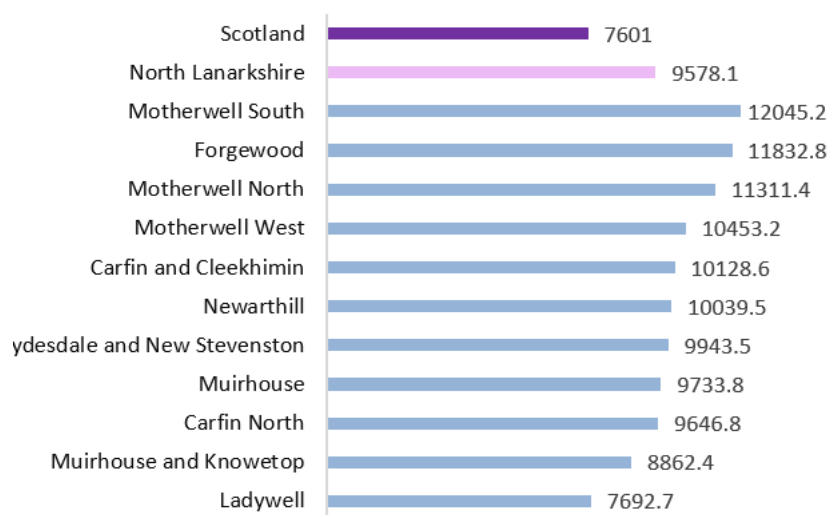
Alcohol related hospital stays, 2016 (rate per 100,000)



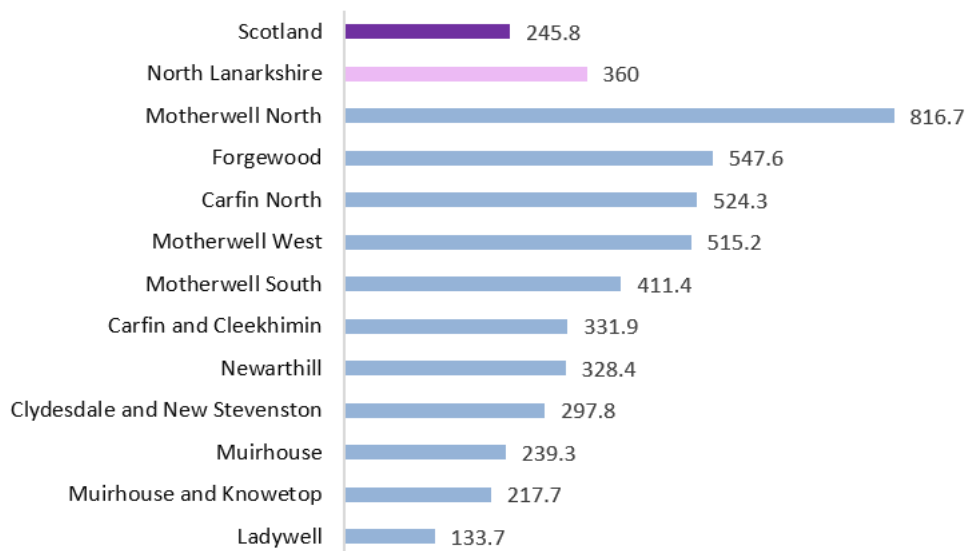
Patients (65+) with multiple emergency hospitalisations 2016 (rate per 100,000)



Patients with emergency hospitalisations 2016 (rate per 100,000)

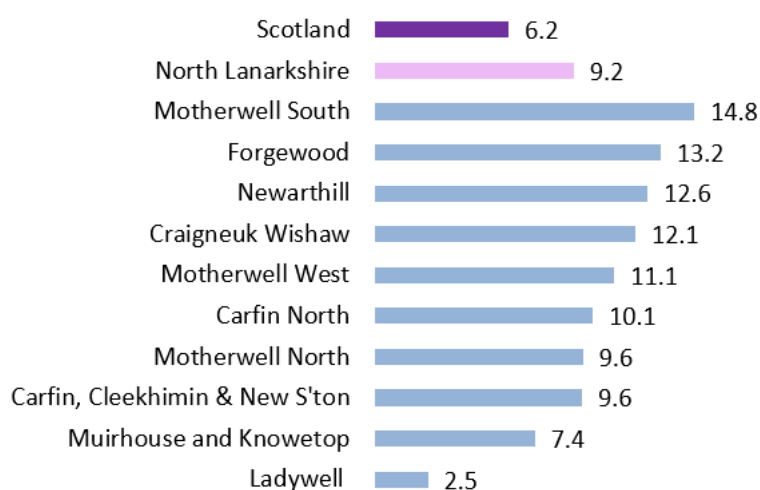


Patients hospitalised with COPD 2014, 3-year aggregates 2013/14 to 2015/16 (rate per 100,000)

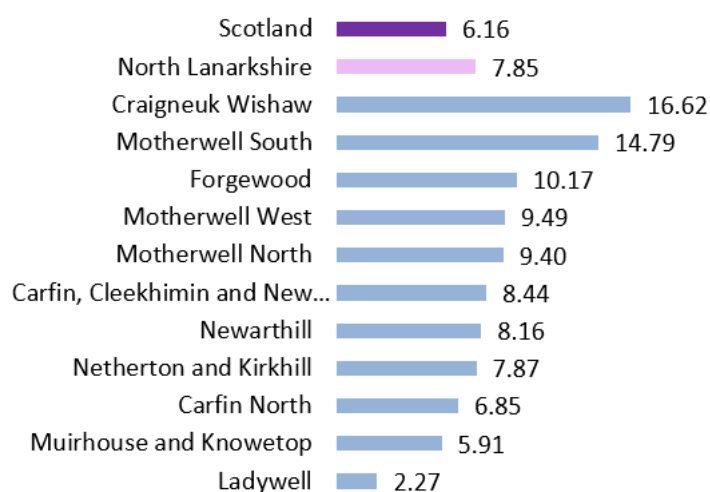

Adults claiming Incapacity Benefit / Severe Disablement Allowance 2015 (%)

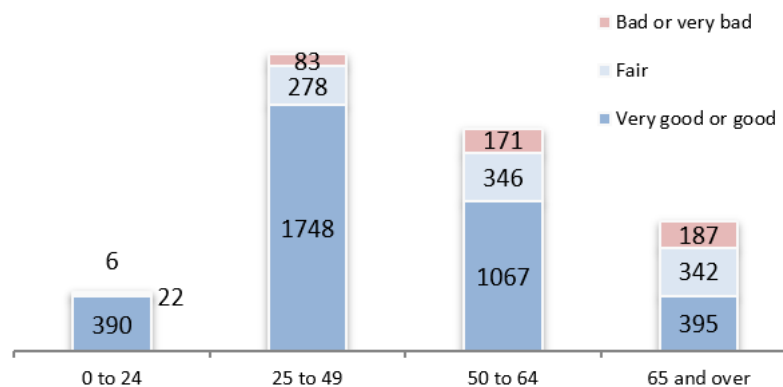

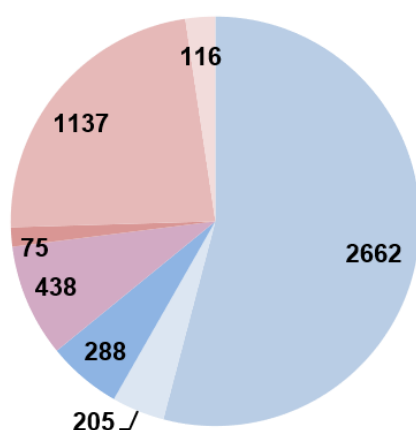
2011 census – Self reported health of carers (Motherwell)



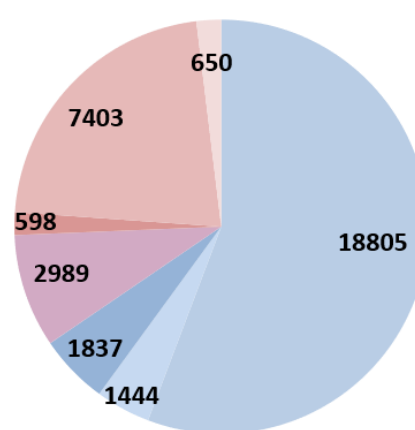
