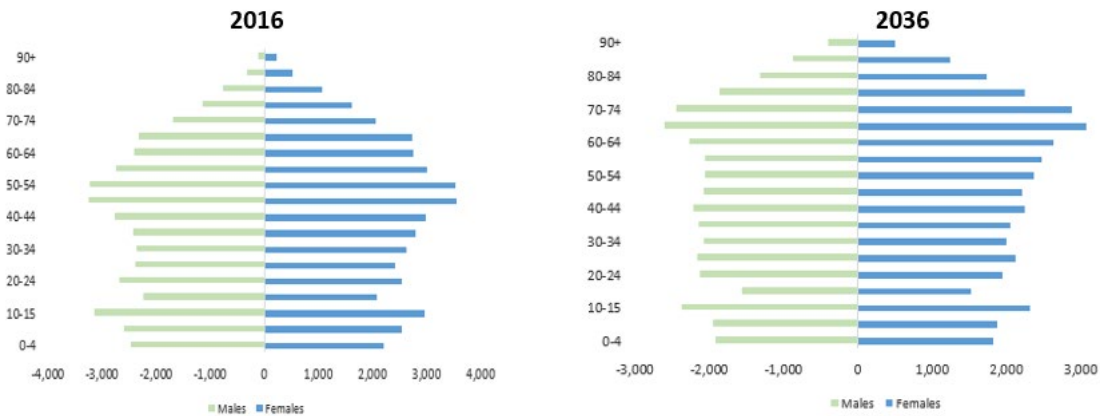

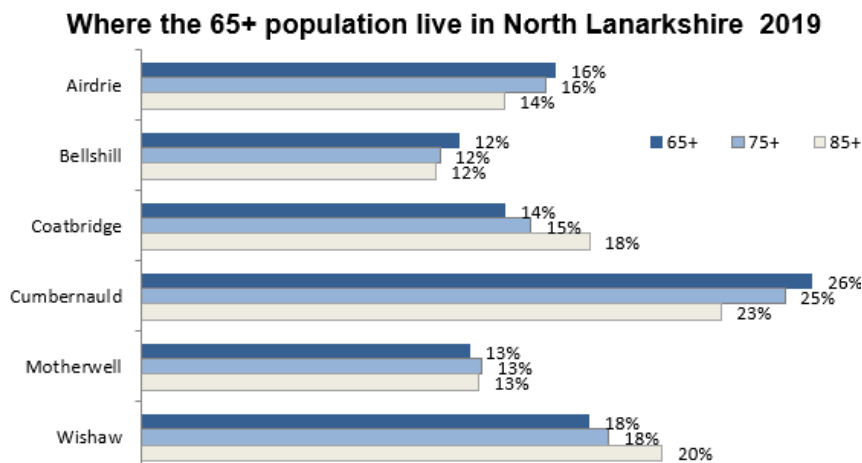

The distribution of the older population across the council is shown in the three graphs below.



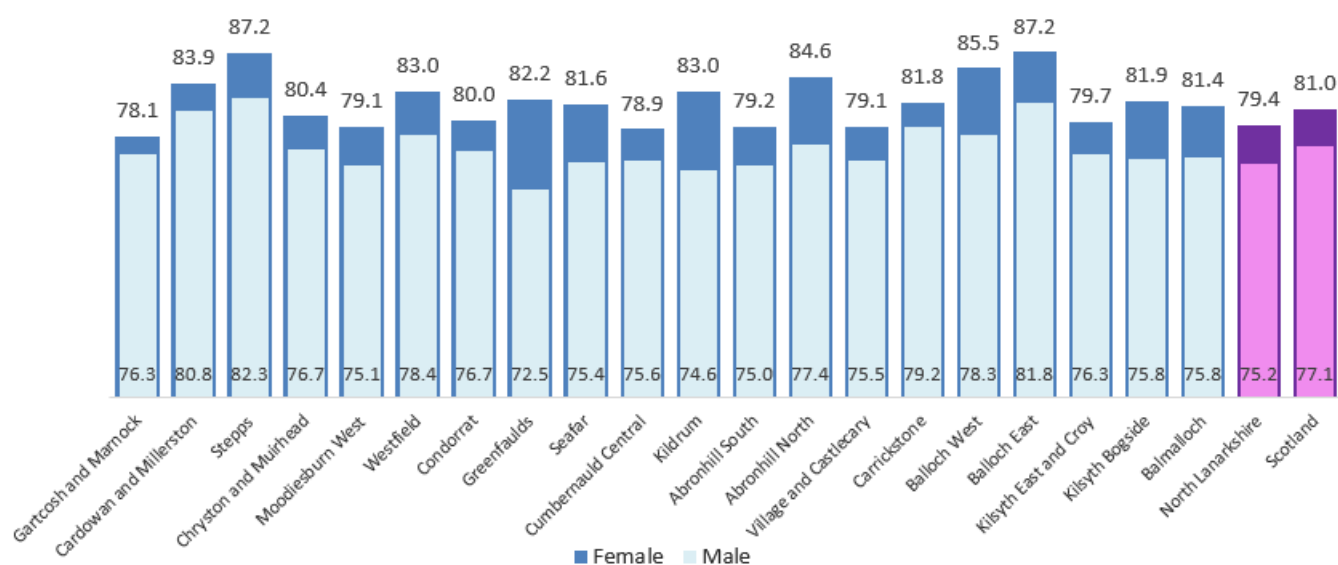
Life Expectancy 2016-2018

N.B. There is no published value for Moodiesburn East females, male life expectancy was 80.3 years

- Male life expectancy is highest in Craigneuk, Airdrie at 85.5 years and lowest in Craigneuk, Wishaw at 65.0 years
- Female life expectancy is highest in 2 areas - Balloch East and Stepps - (87.2 years) and lowest in Craigneuk, Wishaw (69.1 years).

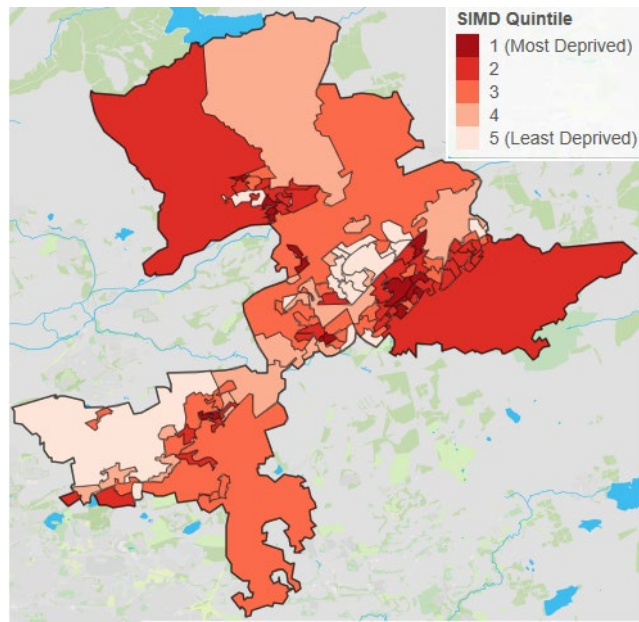
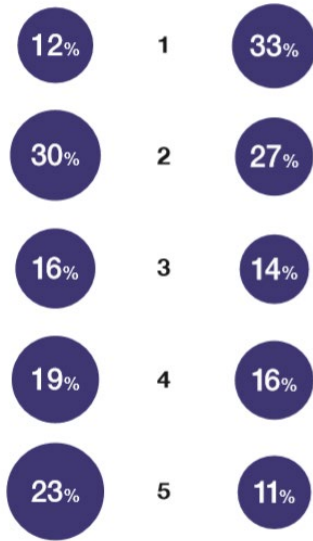

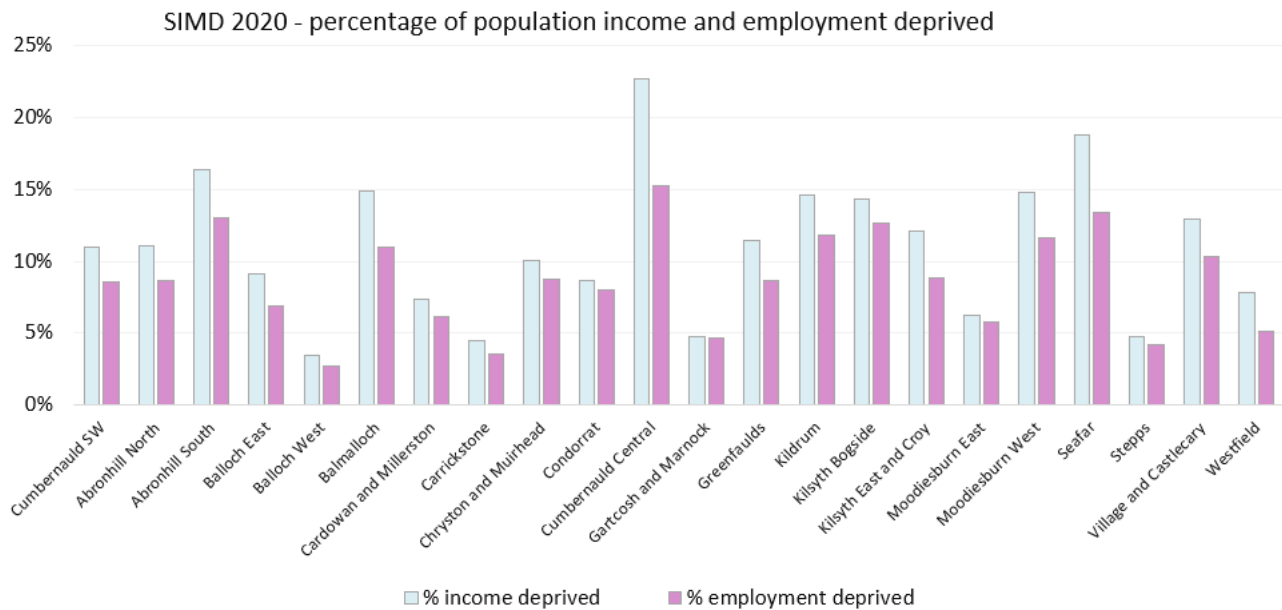

The graph below is from the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD) 2020. It shows the percentage of people who are income and employment deprived within the locality. The number of people who are income deprived includes dependants of someone who is income deprived. This [webpage⁴](#) provides information of the range of income and employment deprivation across North Lanarkshire.



Within the SIMD 2020, other issues highlighted by the data are:

There are 111 datazones across Cumbernauld locality

- Cumbernauld – Millcroft Road is within the 10% most deprived - SIMD Rank 507
- A further 7 datazones are within the 15% most deprived category:
 - Carbrain - Craigieburn Road to Stonylee Road – SIMD rank 730
 - Carbrain - Sandyknowes Road to Craigieburn Road – SIMD rank 810
 - Moodiesburn West - Hilltop Road to Castle Gardens – SIMD rank 834
 - Croy - Constarry Road to Taggart Road – SIMD rank 897
 - Carbrain - Torbrex Road to Glenhove Road – SIMD rank 909
 - Kilsyth - Manse Road to Howe Road – SIMD rank 948
 - Kilsyth - St Patrick's Primary and Kilsyth Primary – SIMD rank 1020

In terms of the health domain – 10 datazones are within the 15% most deprived in the country. These are:

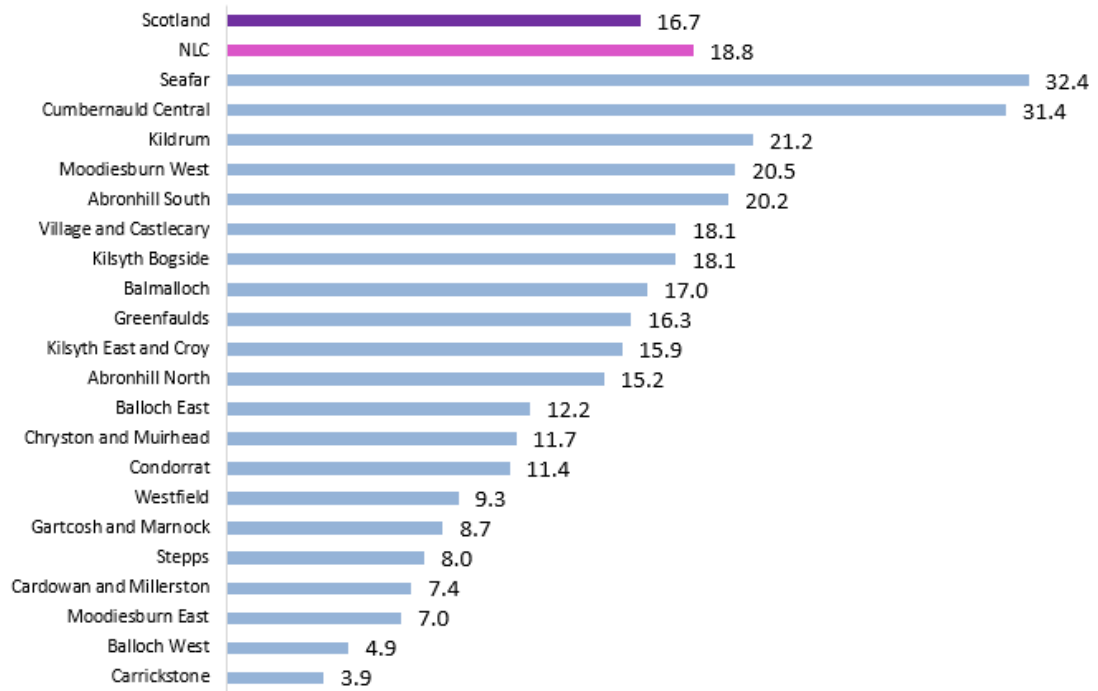

Within the education domain, 6 datazones are in the 15% most deprived nationally, with Cumbernauld – Millcroft Road is the 5% most education deprived.

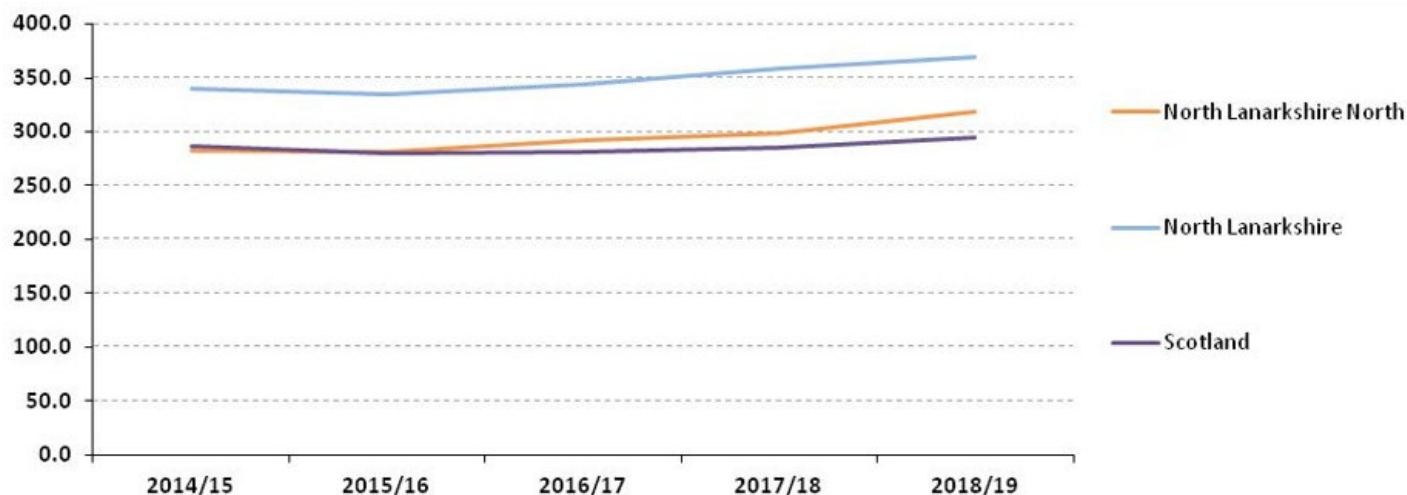
Children in low income households (%) August 2016

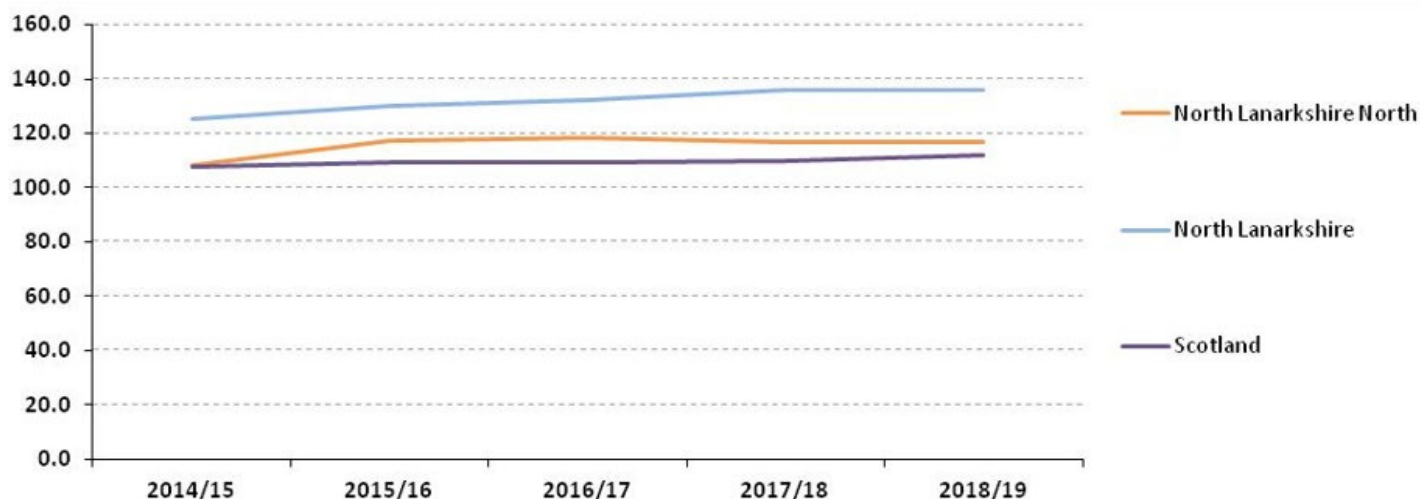
A&E attendances rate per 1,000

North Lanarkshire North's A&E attendance rate has increased by around 13% over the last five years. However, it has been consistently lower compared with North Lanarkshire.

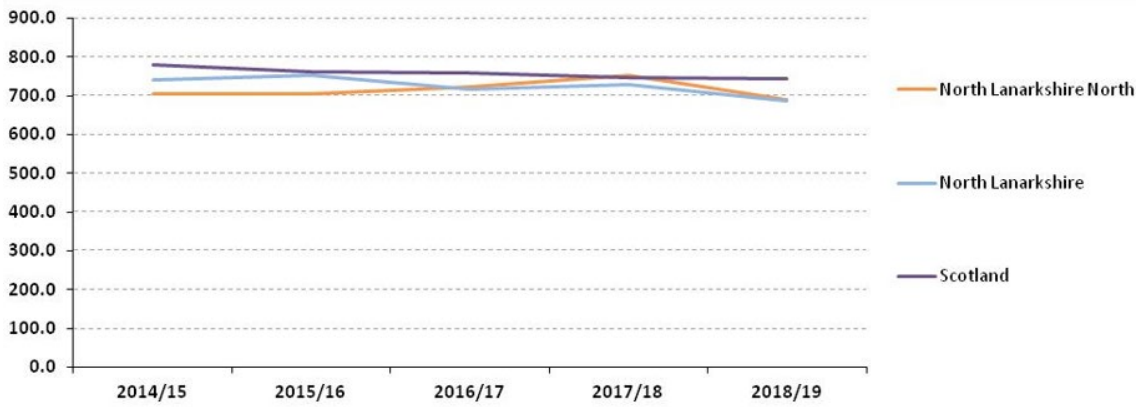
Emergency Admission rate per 1,000

Apart from a slight increase between 2014/15 and 2015/16, North Lanarkshire North's emergency admission rate has remained fairly constant over the last five years. However, North Lanarkshire North's emergency admissions rate has remained consistently lower compared with North Lanarkshire.

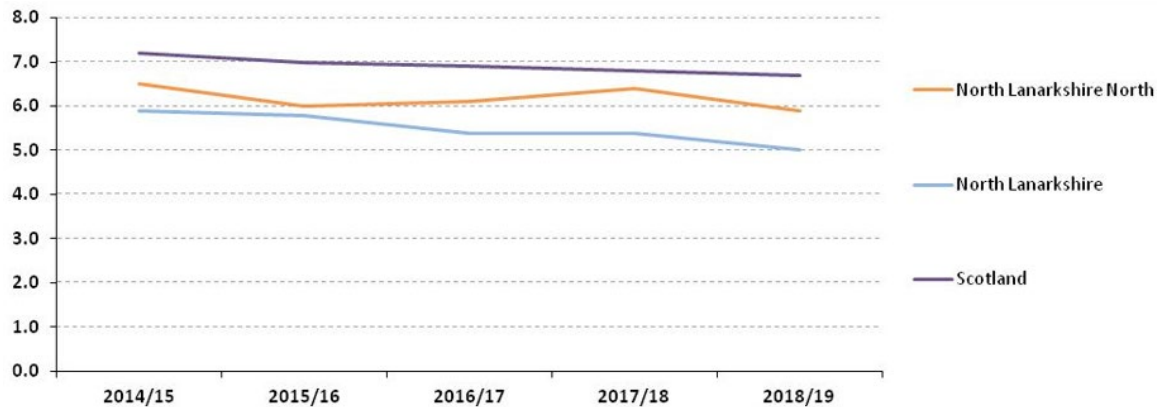
Emergency Admission Bed Days

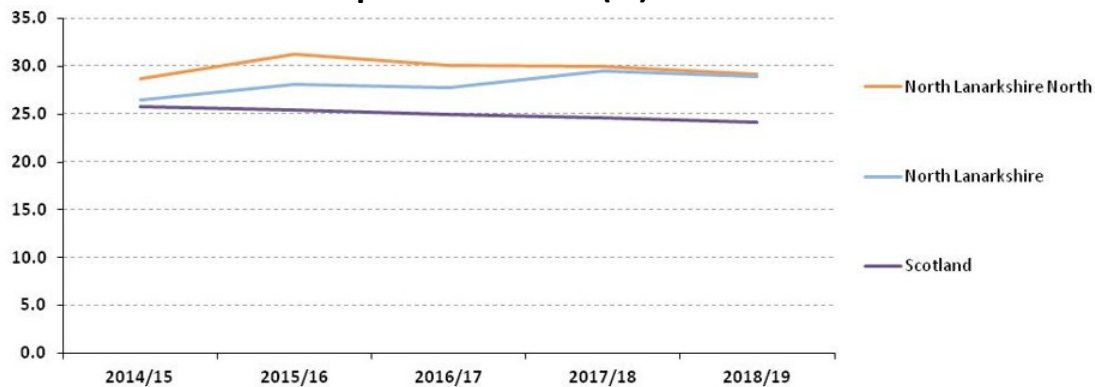
Emergency admission average length of stay rate per 1,000

North Lanarkshire North's average length of stay rate has followed a similar pattern to the partnership and Scotland, with a gradual decreasing trend over the last 5 years.

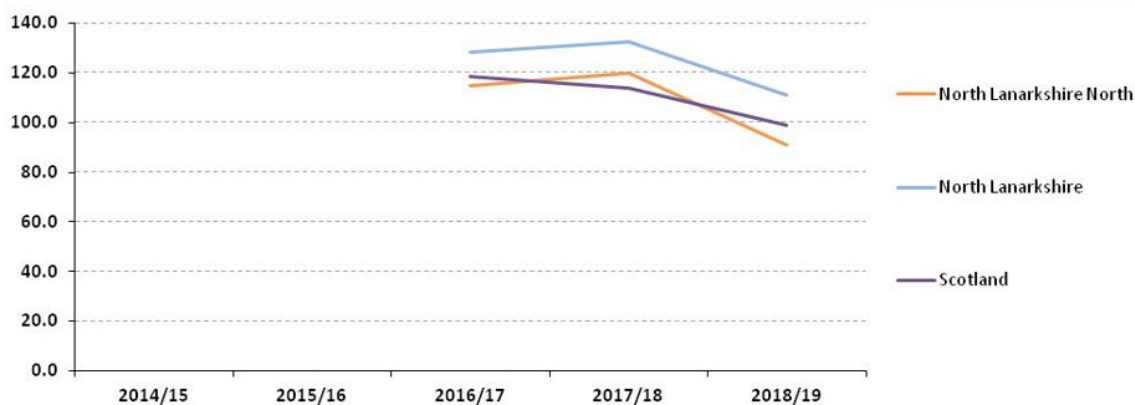
A&E conversion to hospital admission (%)

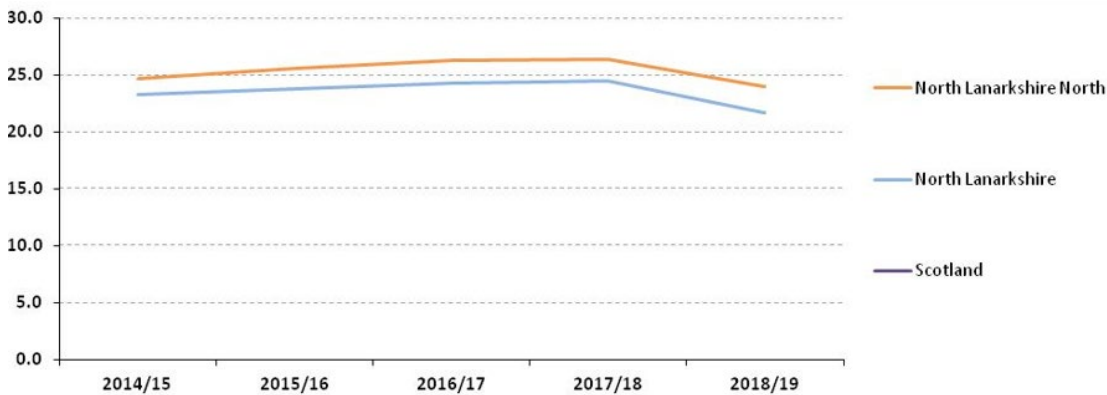
North Lanarkshire North's delayed discharge rate has greatly decreased over the last year and in 2018/19 has fallen below the national rate.

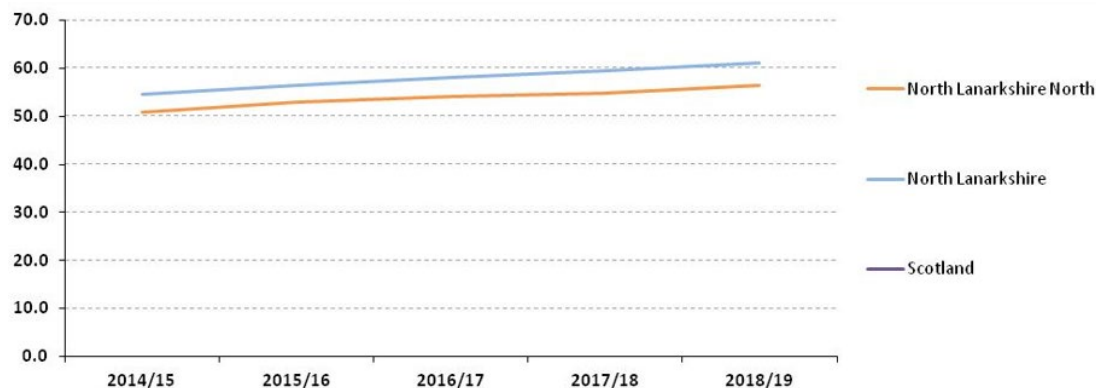

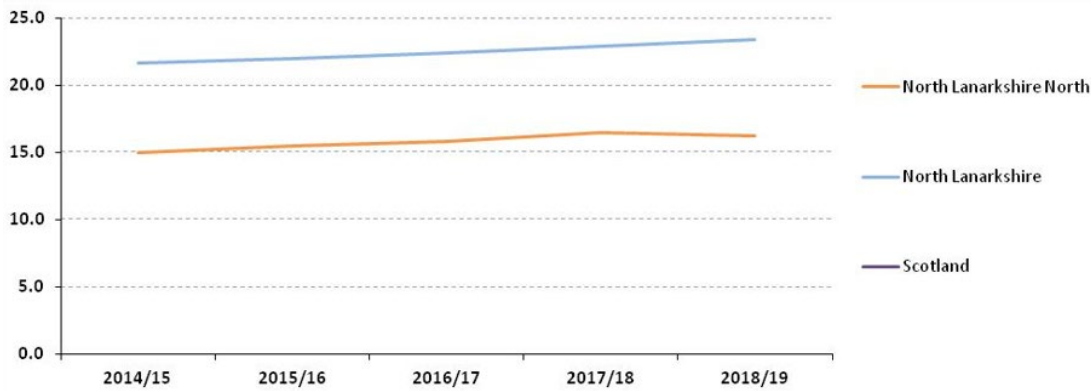
Diabetes prevalence rate per 1,000

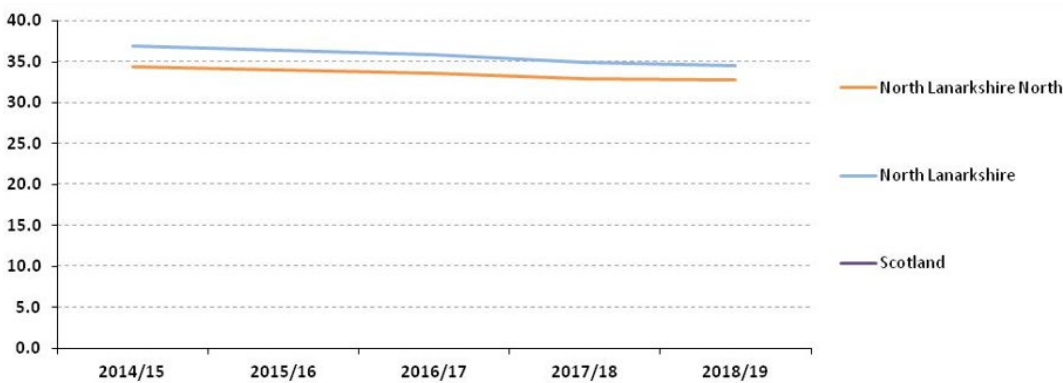
Psychosis prevalence rate per 1,000

Chronic Heart Disease prevalence rate per 1,000



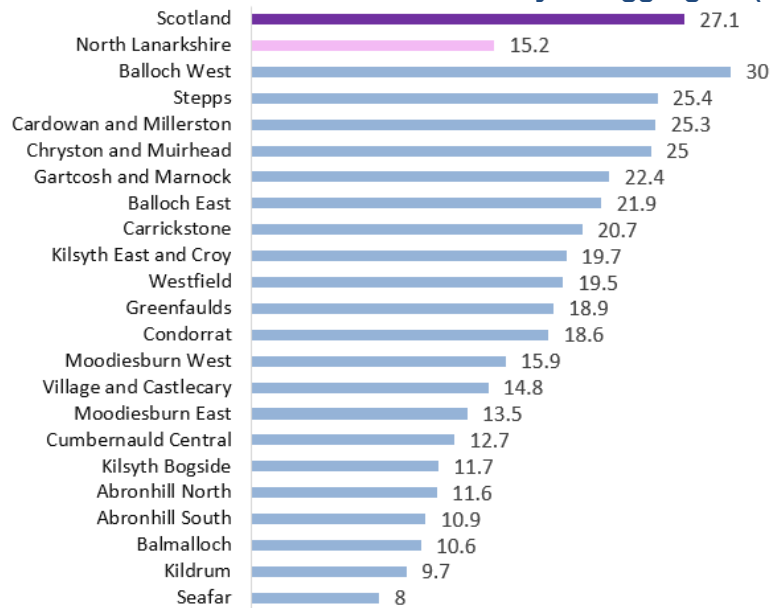

Over the last 5 years, North Lanarkshire North's Chronic heart disease rate has continued to decrease and is the lowest of all the localities.

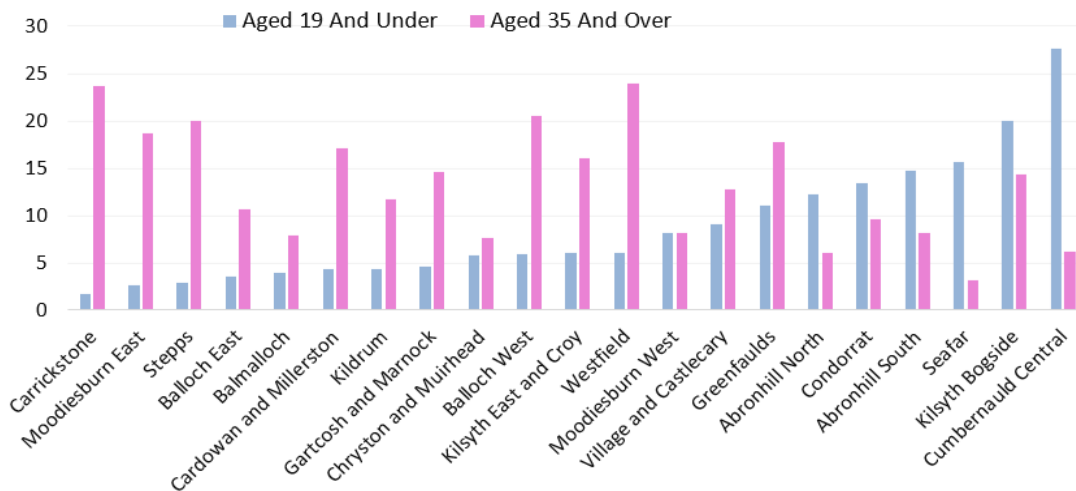
Mother and baby indicators

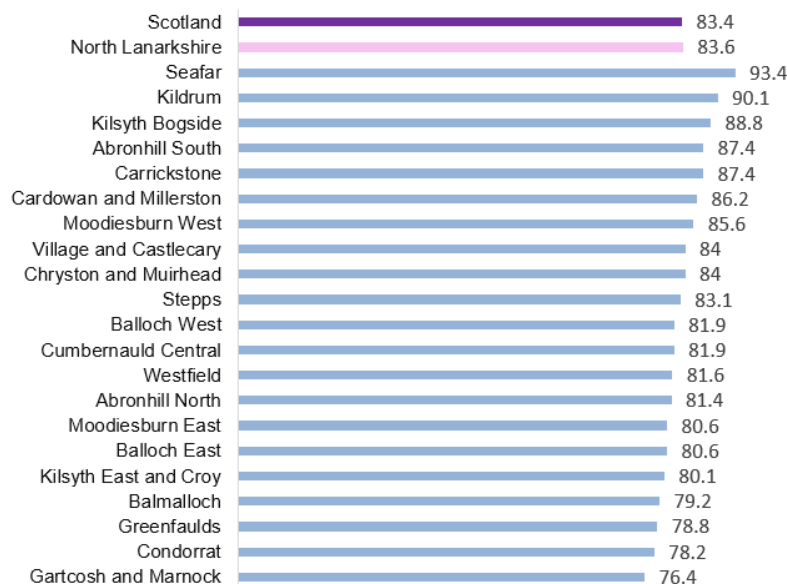
Babies exclusively breastfed at 6-8 weeks – 2015 based on 3 year aggregate (%)



Age of older and younger mothers 2014-2017 3 year aggregate (%)

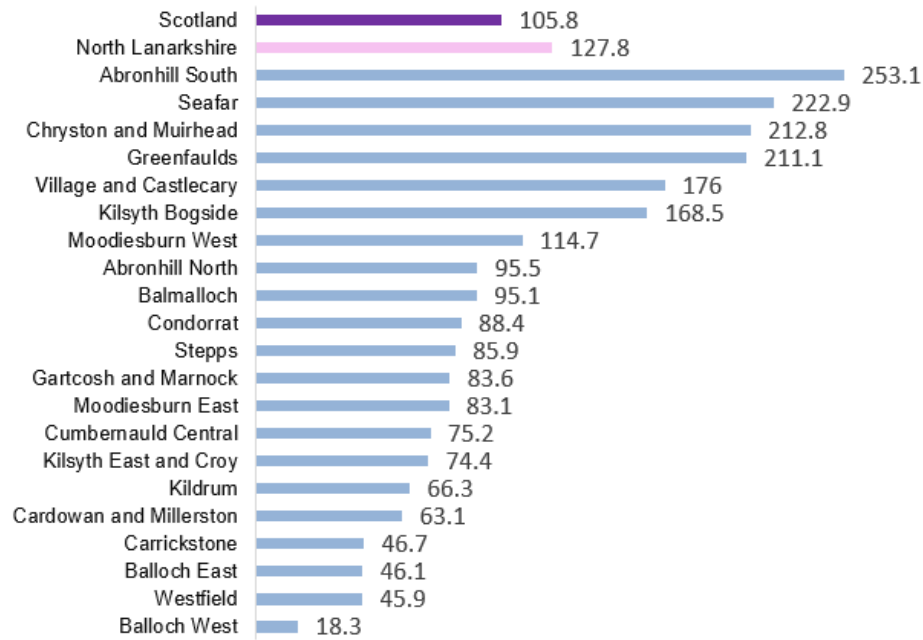


Healthy birth weight babies, 2015 3 year aggregate (%)

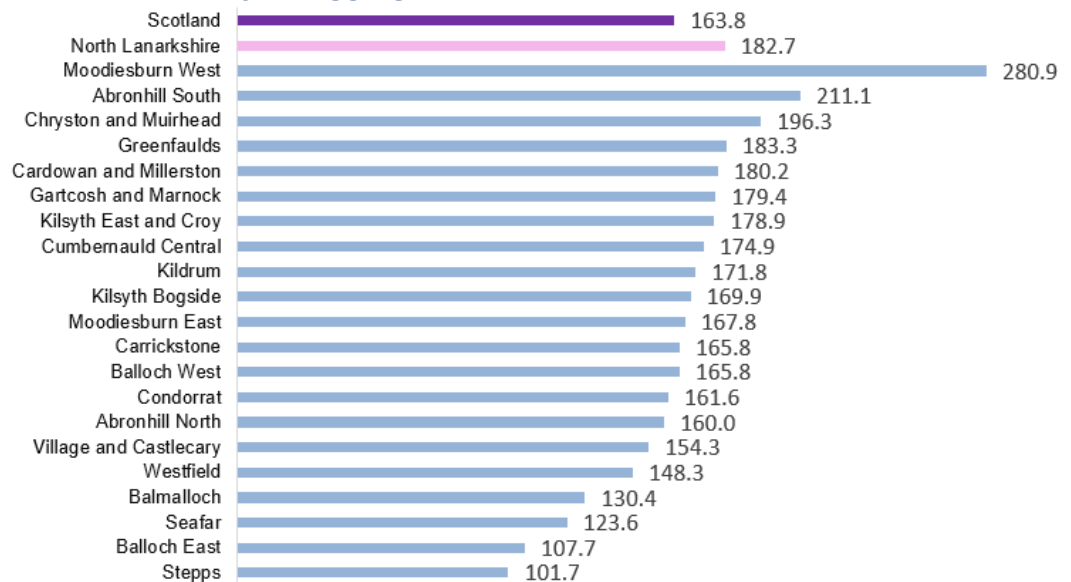

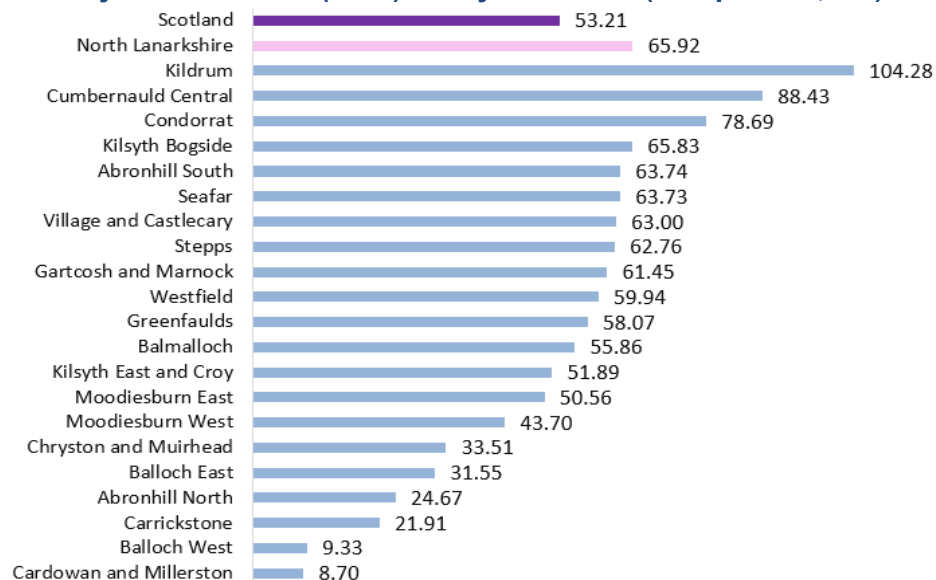
All-cause mortality among the 15-44 year olds 2016 (rate per 100,000)



Early deaths from cancer 2014-2016 3 year aggregate (rate per 100,000)

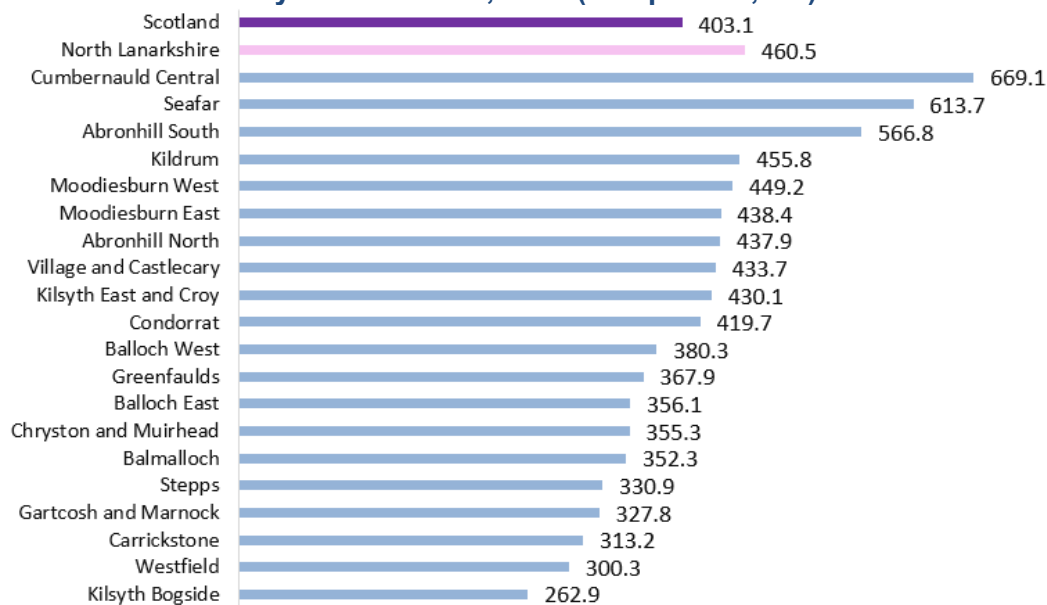


Early deaths from coronary heart disease (CHD) <75 years, 2015 (rate per 100,000)

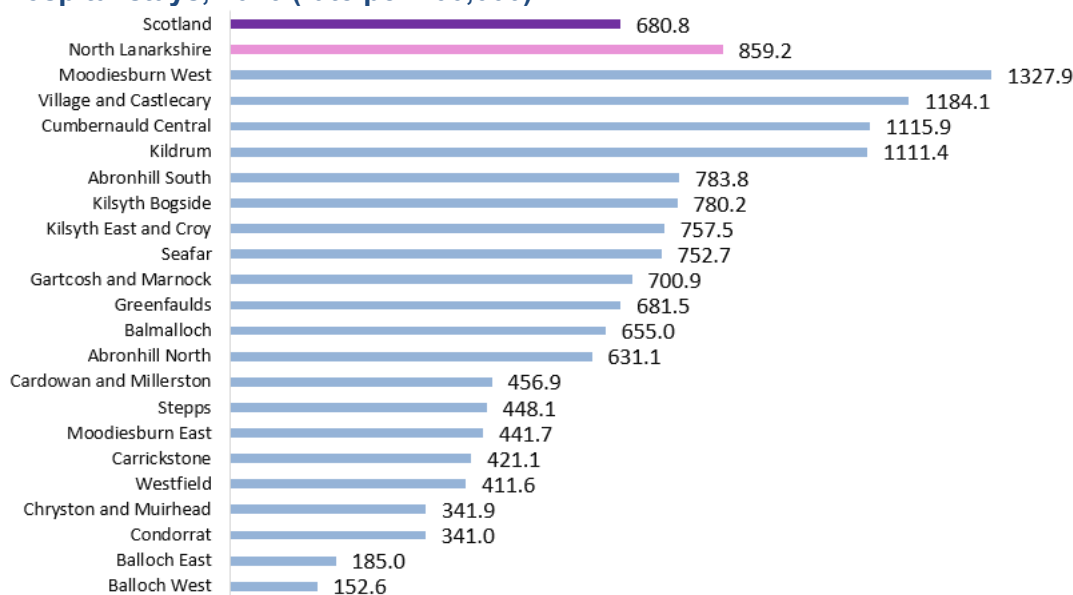

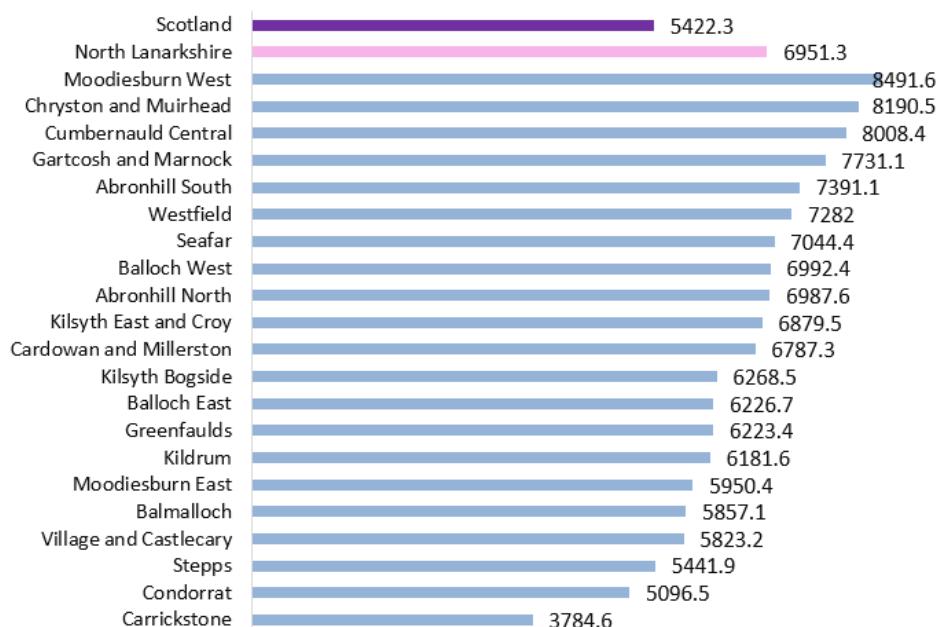
Patients hospitalised with coronary heart disease, 2014 (rate per 100,000)



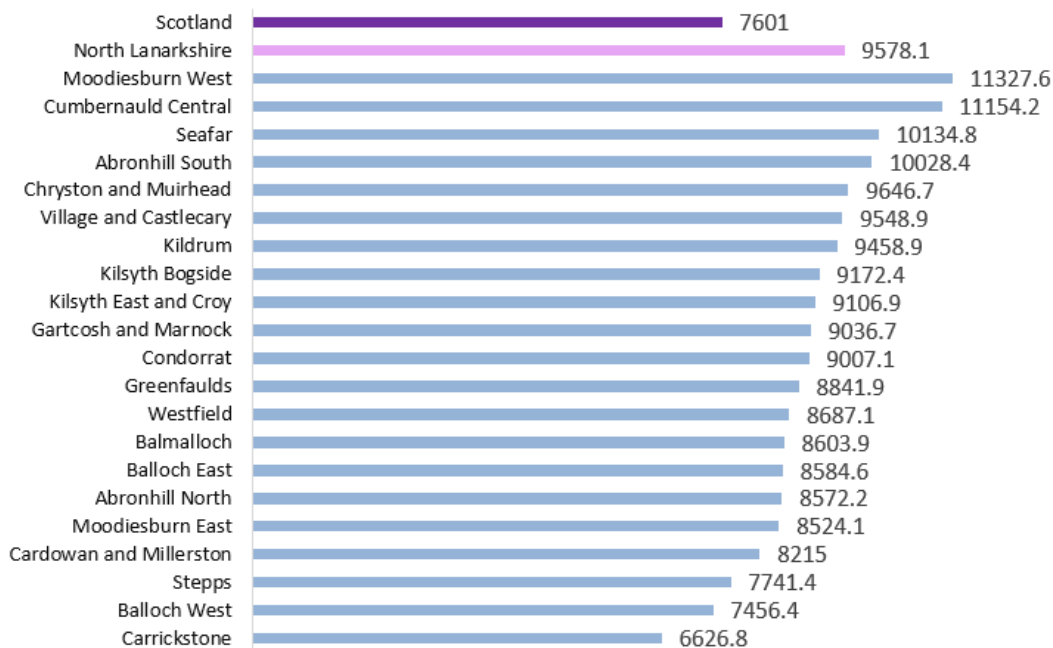
Alcohol related hospital stays, 2016 (rate per 100,000)



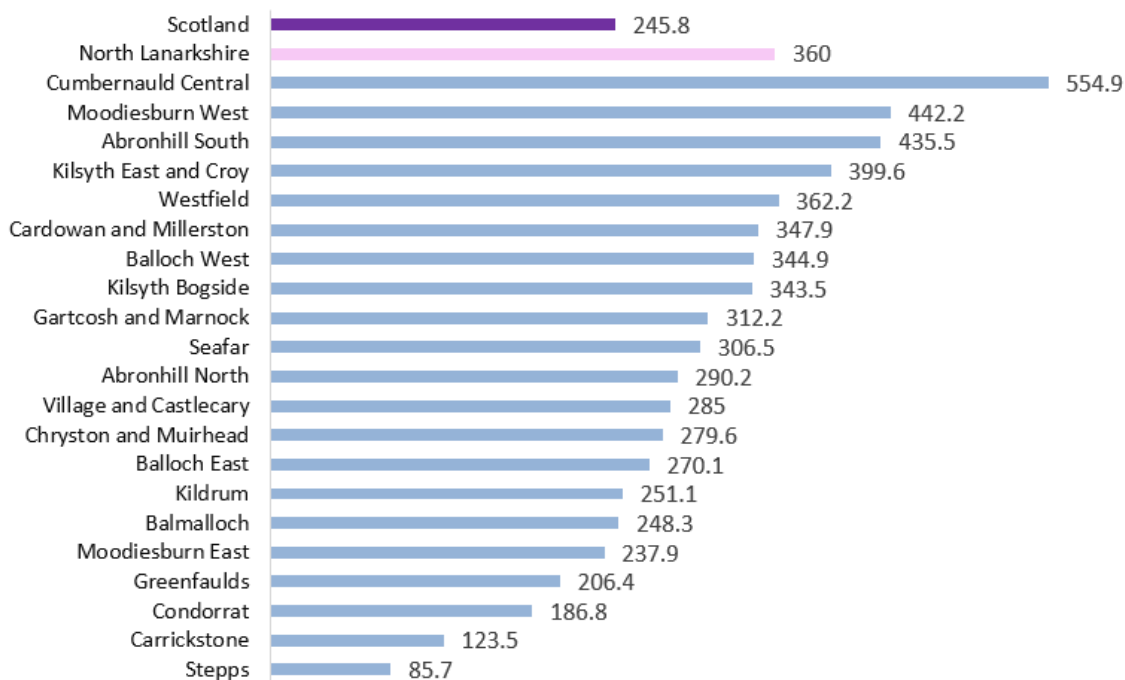
Patients (65+) with multiple emergency hospitalisations 2016 (rate per 100,000)



Patients with emergency hospitalisations 2016 (rate per 100,000)

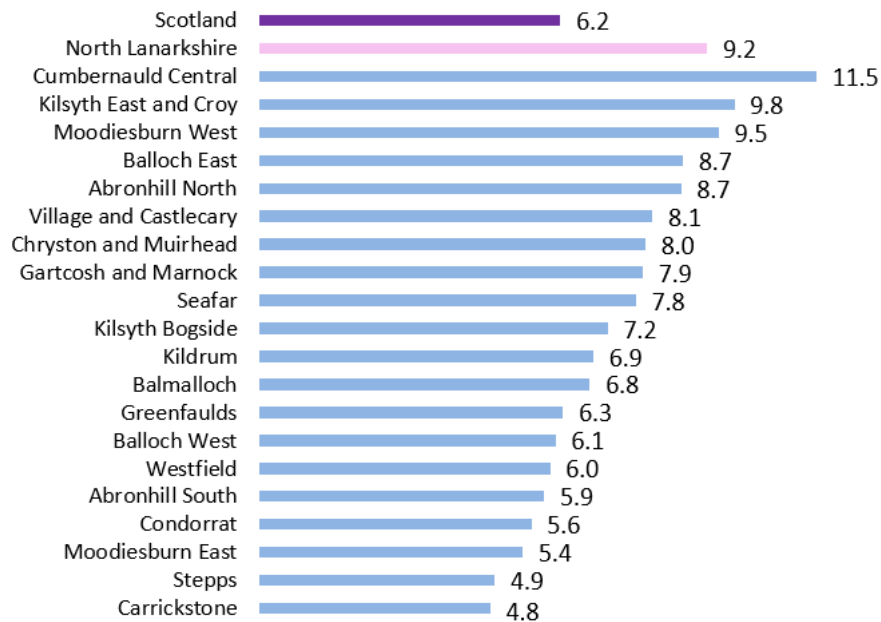


Patients hospitalised with COPD 2014, 3-year aggregates 2013/14 to 2015/16 (rate per 100,000)

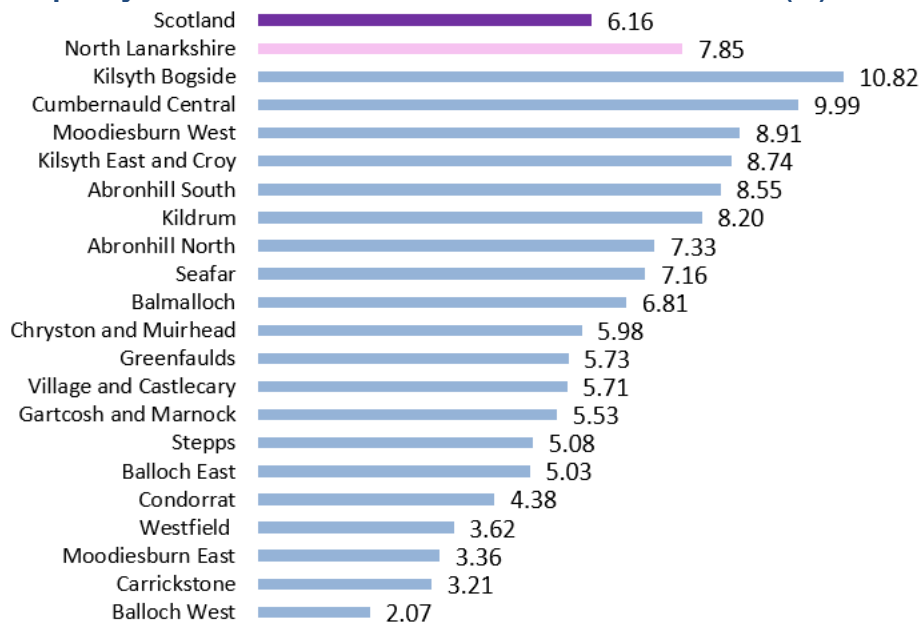

Adults Claiming Incapacity Benefit / Severe Disablement Allowance 2015 (%)

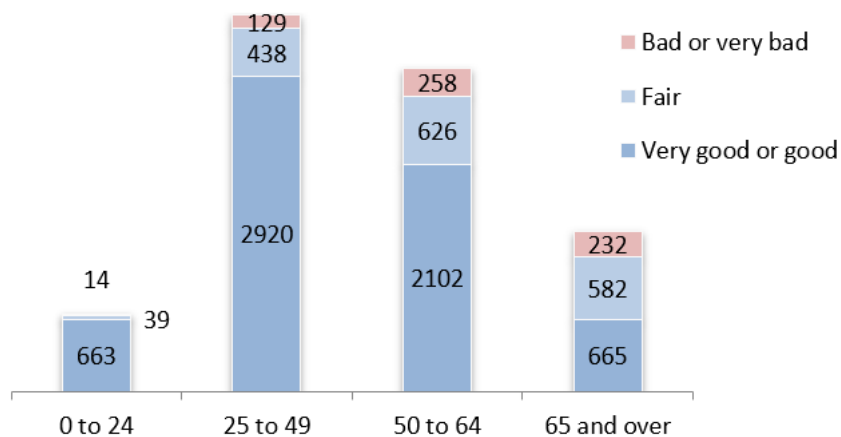

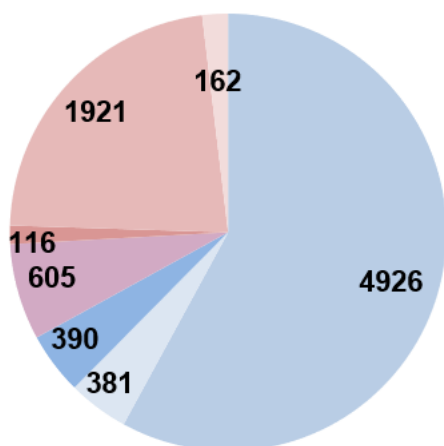
