

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of NL Property Investments Limited (the 'Company') for the year ended 31 March 2018, which comprise the Profit and loss account, the Balance sheet and the related notes, including a summary of significant accounting policies. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2018

1. General information

The Company is a private company limited by shares and is incorporated in Scotland. The address of its registered office is NL Property Investments Limited, Civic Centre, Windmillhill Street, Motherwell, Lanarkshire, ML1 1AB.

2. Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention unless otherwise specified within these accounting policies and in accordance with Section 1A of Financial Reporting Standard 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland and the Companies Act 2006.

2.2 Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by the FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland":

- the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows;

- the requirements of Section 12 Other Financial Instruments paragraphs 12.26 to 12.27, 12.29(a), 12.29(b) and 12.29A.

This information is included in the consolidated financial statements of North Lanarkshire Council as at 31 March 2018 and these financial statements may be obtained from Companies House, 139 Fountainbridge, Edinburgh, EH3 9FF.

2.3 Valuation of investments

Fixed asset Investments are stated at cost.

2.4 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash is represented by cash in hand and deposits with financial institutions repayable without penalty on notice of not more than 24 hours. Cash equivalents are highly liquid investments that mature in no more than three months from the date of acquisition and that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash with insignificant risk of change in value.

2.5 Creditors

Short term creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial liabilities, including bank loans, are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.
