Chryston High School Extension Newsletter – May 2025

Progress to Date

Construction of the extension facilities commenced on 14th April 2025. The site hoarding has been installed near the school main entrance to secure the site. The cut and fill exercise has commenced to create the site platform.

Upcoming Developments

Drainage and foundation works will commence, with precast and steel piling starting in June.

Work will begin with the creation of a new car park. This area will be used initially for the main site offices and welfare area. Construction deliveries and soil removal will be via Pentland Road. The site workforce will access the site via Lindsaybeg Road.

Small refurbishment works will start within the existing school in June.

Maintenance works will be carried out during the school summer holiday period to the existing 11-a-side pitch. It is anticipated that the works will take six weeks, and the pitch will be closed off to the public for the duration of the works.
