- Sustainable garden


So, get involved and showcase your beautiful space.

How your rent supports services and investment

In 2024/25, we collected **£158 million in rent**, which represents **99.6% of the rent due** - a strong result that helps us

Our dedicated Housing Income Maximisers, who are trained to support tenants at every stage of their tenancy, also helped generate an impressive £20 million in additional income for tenants over the same period.

Thanks to the rent collected:

- we provided housing services for over 36,000 homes
- 96% of repairs were completed on time
- 94% of repairs were completed right first time

We're also continuing our ambitious £122 million Housing Capital Programme for 2024/25. This investment supports:

- upgrading existing homes to extend their lifespan and improve living conditions
- increasing housing supply by building new council homes and buying back former council or market homes

To support tenants' independence, we also invested £1.6 million to complete 1,063 home adaptations, making homes safer and more accessible for those who need it.

The strategy will guide future decisions on housing policy, investment and services to ensure that homes are sustainable, affordable, and of high-quality.

We are currently preparing a draft based on the housing issues and the priorities you have told us matter most.

These include increasing access to affordable housing and tackling homelessness.

The draft version of the strategy will be available for public consultation on the council's website over the summer.

Your feedback will help us finalise the strategy and ensure it reflects the real priorities of our communities.

Money worries can affect anyone. Our friendly team of Income Maximisers is here to support you with advice and practical help to ease financial pressure and protect your tenancy. **We can:**

- carry out a free financial assessment to make sure you're receiving all the benefits you're entitled to
- help you apply for Universal Credit, Housing Benefit, Council Tax Reduction, and Community Care Grants
- support you to challenge benefit decisions or request a mandatory reconsideration
- provide advice or signpost support for managing debts

Last year, our team helped tenants access over **£20 million** in additional income, so let us help.

Recycling tips

Thank you to all our tenants who recycle your household waste.




To help us recycle more, please put paper and cardboard only in your blue household recycling bin. This includes, cereal boxes and other card products, newspapers and magazines, egg boxes, greetings cards and corrugated cardboard.

But it must be clean or it can't be recycled. For example, pizza boxes with oil and food on them can't go in your blue bin.

Similarly, tissues, kitchen roll, wallpaper, padded envelopes and disposable cups can't be recycled in your blue bin. So please put these in your general waste bin.

Motherwell Towers to come down in controlled blowdown

The skyline of Motherwell is set to change later this year with the planned demolition of Allan, Coursington, and Draffen Towers. These high-rise blocks will be brought down in a single controlled blowdown, a method confirmed by expert engineers as the safest and most effective option.

The exact date of the demolition has yet to be confirmed, but it is expected to take place later this year. Extensive planning is underway to ensure the process is carried out safely and with minimal disruption to the local community.

Residents and local businesses recently attended local drop in sessions and will continue to be kept fully informed as more details become available.

Changes to First Stop Shop Services

From 2 June, we made changes to the operation of our First Stop Shops.

Key changes include:

- Local Housing Surgeries established in Kilsyth, Moodiesburn, Viewpark, and Bellshill maintaining service access.
- Integration of First Stop Shops into local housing offices in Airdrie, Coatbridge, Motherwell, Wishaw, Cumbernauld and Shotts.
- All offices will move to **cashless payments only**.

New community garden blooms in Strathclyde Country Park

A new community garden has been created in Strathclyde Country Park, offering a welcoming space where residents can sit, relax, and enjoy the natural surroundings.

This project was a joint effort between Bellshill Community Council, our Greenspace Projects Team, and landscape architects, who worked together to design a peaceful and inclusive area. The garden features a variety of benches, planters, wildflowers,

trees, and even solitary bee monoliths, supporting local wildlife and biodiversity.

Located at the Bellshill Gateway, the garden is a valuable new feature along the nature trail leading to the South Calder walkway.
