#### Introduction

The Census is undertaken by the National Records of Scotland every 10 years and provides a picture of all the people and households in Scotland.

The Census asks questions about a person, their household, and their home.

All data obtained through the Census information is anonymised, and the actual Census records are kept secure for 100 years.

The data obtained from the Census helps to build a detailed snapshot of society.

It helps the government and local authorities to plan and fund local services.

For example, Census data showing how many people work in different jobs and industries are used to develop new policies in relation to employment. Information on how people travel to work and how many cars they have contributes to roads and transport planning.

This report is based on data for Census Output Areas. Output Areas (OAs) are the key geography for dissemination of small area statistics from the Census. OAs are large enough for Census statistics to be released without infringing confidentiality. They are designed to have relatively small numbers of households (in the range of 25 to 89) and population (>=60), while nesting within council areas.


For 2022 the Output Area data that the council use in all Census reports has had 'key perturbation' by National Records of Scotland (NRS). This is a measure that NRS have implemented to ensure that people could not be personally identified via certain figures. For example if there was a postcode with only one resident living there, you could identify personal information about that specific person using the data.

NRS can confirm that these differences are an intended result of their Statistical Disclosure Control strategy. When a Census table is created, small adjustments will be made automatically to cells in the table. This means that cells might not sum to sub totals and totals due to these Statistical Disclosure Controls (SDC). **More information about SDC from Scotland's Census is available here Statistical disclosure control | Scotland's Census** 

In the example on the left, you will note that 166,081 males added to 175,193 females does not total 341,117. Key perturbation has made a slight variance in the figures which is to be expected.

Specific graphs will have these totals on the right side of screen to highlight perturbation also. When you see percentage figures for any of the graphs, they reflect the percentage of the output figure. For example you'll see in the 'ethnic group' report that 1.57% of people are White Polish. That means 1.57% of the ethnic group output figure of 341,091.

Some of these figures will also have variances because some outputs will only contain total amount of people in a certain situation or over/under a certain age.





Population difference from 2011 to 2022



















Percent of population by english language skills






Percent of population by gaelic language skills








Percent of population by UK armed forces veterans (aged 16 or over)




Percent of population by sexual orientation (aged 16 or over)






















#### North Lanarkshire Census 2022 - Central heating

Percentage of households by central heating (2001 definitions)




Percentage of households by central heating type (2011 definitions)





## **Migration**

#### Introduction

The Census is undertaken by the National Records of Scotland every 10 years and provides a picture of all the people and households in Scotland.

The Census asks questions about a person, their household, and their home.

All data obtained through the Census information is anonymised, and the actual Census records are kept secure for 100 years.

The data obtained from the Census helps to build a detailed snapshot of society.

It helps the government and local authorities to plan and fund local services.

For example, Census data showing how many people work in different jobs and industries are used to develop new policies in relation to employment. Information on how people travel to work and how many cars they have contributes to roads and transport planning.

#### 2022 Census in Scotland



Percentage of people that migrated to North Lanarkshire from outside of the UK - by age of arrival as declared in 2022


































