

## **PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE CONDITIONS**

- (1) The use of the subjects is restricted to the following kinds of entertainment, viz:-

- (2) The number of persons admitted to the subjects at any one time shall not exceed:-

- (3) The subjects may be open for the purposes of entertainment only during the following times:-

- (4) The licenceholder will ensure that he is adequately covered for third party liability insurance in respect of the permitted entertainment in the subjects;
- (5) A minimum horizontal distance of eight metres must be maintained between the boundary of any dwellinghouse or building and the show devices or equipment;
- (6) The arrangements of stalls, booths, etc must be such that at least two exits 1.5 metres in width are provided for the public access to the roadway;
- (7) Fire fighting equipment of a type and number appropriate for the stalls and machines, etc and in accordance with the Showmen's Guild requirements must be provided;
- (8) The siting and direction of all devices, structures, etc must be to the satisfaction of the Director of Planning and Environment (Building Control Section);
- (9) The appropriate "Certificate of Engineers Inspection" issued by the Showmen's Guild must be displayed on or near to each device;
- (10) All catering facilities provided must comply with the provisions of the Food Safety Act 1990 and vehicles must have a valid Certificate of Compliance in respect of the Food Safety (General Food Hygiene) Regulations 1995;
- (11) At the end of the public entertainment the subjects shall be left in a clean and tidy condition;
- (12) Provision must be made for the storage, collection and disposal of refuse, and the licence holder must ensure that litter does not escape from the venue site onto surrounding land. Arrangements can be made for the Council to collect and dispose of refuse on a chargeable basis and Protective Services should be contacted regarding this matter;
- (13) A fully equipped first-aid point, located at a conspicuous site, and conveniently situated at the event requires to be provided.
- (14) The event organisers will be required to comply with the provisions of the Health and Safety at work etc Act 1974 and should have available for inspection by the relevant enforcing authority a statement of their policy with respect to health and safety and the means by which the policy is carried out;

- (15) All reasonable precautions must be taken to ensure that noise emissions occurring as a result of the event do not cause noise nuisance to persons living in the vicinity of the venue.
- (16) Suitable and sufficient public toilet facilities should be provided having regard to the following:-
1. Total number of persons expected to attend the event at any one time.
  2. Duration of event; and
  3. Male/Female ratio.

Toilets must be serviced and cleaned as required throughout the course of the event.

- (17) The licence holder must ensure certificates of fitness for each machine used can be produced, accompanied by receipt of the last premium paid in respect of insurance. The licence holder shall maintain third party liability insurance in respect of all apparatus used in connection with the public entertainment and in respect of all third party risks arising from the public entertainment.
